## ORDINANCES SECOND READING

The following Ordinances were in City Council November 3, 1994, Read and Passed, the First Time, and are Severally Returned for Passage the Second Time:

**An Ordinance to authorize the issuance of Water Revenue Bonds not to exceed Twelve Million Dollars (\$12,000,000.00).**

*Be it Ordained by the City of Providence:*

**Section 1.** A sum not in excess of \$12,000,000 shall be borrowed from the Rhode Island Clean Water Finance Agency for the purpose of financing the capital improvement program of the Providence Water Supply Board. Repayment of this loan shall be made solely from revenues of

the water supply system and such revenues may be pledged as security for the loan. The City Treasurer, with the approval of the Mayor, is authorized to sell up to \$12,000,000 in Water Revenue Bonds to the Rhode Island Clean Water Finance Agency, pursuant to Section 46-12.8-9 of the General Laws and other laws applicable thereto, to determine and approve the manner of sale, denominations, interest rates and other terms and conditions of the Bonds, to issue the Bonds and enter into a loan agreement with the Clean Water Finance Agency and take such other

actions in furtherance hereof as may be necessary or desirable.

*Section 2.* The Bonds authorized herein may be refunded from time to time by resolution of the City Council and by issuance of water revenue bonds therefore.

*Section 3.* This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

An Ordinance Amending Chapter 2, Article XIX, Sec. 2-300, entitled: "Administration" and deleting Secs. 2-299 and 301 of the same Chapter.

*Be it Ordained by the City of Providence:*

*Section 1.* Chapter 2, Article XIX of the Code of Ordinances for the City of Providence, entitled Administration, is hereby amended to read as follows:

*Section 2-300.* Every warden and clerk appointed under the provisions of Title 17 of the Rhode Island General Laws, 1956, or any amendment thereof or addition thereto, shall be paid one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00) for services rendered on behalf of the City of Providence relative to elections. Every supervisor appointed under said provisions of said Title 17 shall be paid one hundred and twenty-five dollars (\$125.00) for services rendered on behalf of the City of Providence relative to elections. For the purposes of this section, "services rendered on behalf" of the City of Providence shall include all training sessions and meetings prior to the election as well as services rendered at the polling place at elections. Wardens, clerks and supervisors shall only be entitled to compensation if they have attended all such sessions, meetings and all services relative to elections. Workers called in for service on Election Day shall not have to attend training sessions and their pay shall be reduced by \$50.00.

*Section 2.* Chapter 2, Article XIX, Section 2-299 and Section 2-301 of the Code of Ordinances



of the City of Providence, entitled Administration, are hereby deleted.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and shall apply to the election of November 8, 1994.
