# RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE, RHODE ISLAND, TO FILE AN AMENDMENT TO THE FISCAL YEAR 1982 APPLICATION FOR FUNDING UNDER THE HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT ACT.

WHEREAS, The City of Providence is eligible to receive Community Development Block Grant Entitlement Funds for fiscal year 1982 under Section 106(a) or (h) of Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 and 1980 (Public Law 93-383); and

WHEREAS, The said Amendment to the Application for Funding shall be filed with the Boston Area Office of the Department of Housing and Urban Development as soon as possible.

NOW THEREFORE, The City Council of the City of Providence, County of Providence, State of Rhode Island, hereby authorize the City of Providence, through its official representative, the Mayor, to file an amendment to the fiscal year 1982 Community Development Block Grant Application for Funding for the purposes of using allocated but unexpended funds for interim, fixed-rate, low-interest loans for economic development projects.


Attached for the council's consideration and approval is an amendment to the Mayor's Office of Community Development Fiscal Year 1982 Application.
