## CHAPTER 1699

### No. 413 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS 197 and 198 of CHAPTER 2 OF THE REVISED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE, 1946, AS AMENDED.

Approved June 15, 1965

### *Be it ordained by the City of Providence:*

Section 1. Section 197 of Chapter 2 of the Revised Ordinances of 1946 as amended is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 197. PENALTIES -- PARKING FINES WHEN APPEARING BEFORE CLERK OF COURT.

The general penalties provided for by section 10, chapter 1, Revised Ordinances of the City of Providence, 1946, shall apply to violation of this article or any regulations made thereunder except that any person electing to appear before the clerk of court, instead of a personal appearance before the police court as provided, and admitting the violation charged, shall be punished by a fine as hereinafter respectively set forth:

Where the overtime parking shall occur in a metered space it shall be a separate violation for vehicles remained parked in said space for each consecutive unit of time beyond the first unit of time up to a maximum of three violations. A unit of time shall mean the period of permitted parking time. The additional One (\$1.00) Dollar fine for the privilege of paying by mail shall be for the total number of violations and not separately for each violation.

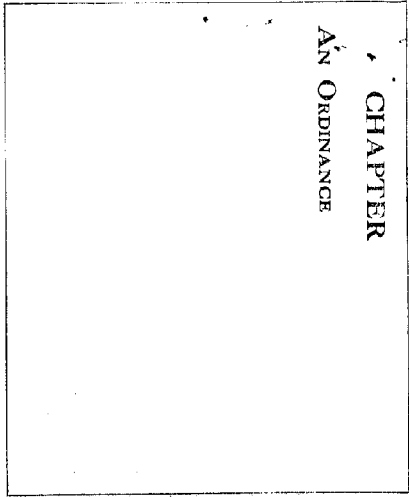
Sec. 2. Sec. 198 of Chapter 2 of the Revised Ordinances of 1946 as amended is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 198. PARKING FINES WHEN APPEARING BEFORE OR MAILING TO  
CLERK OF COURT--PROCEDURE

A person charged with the violation of any traffic regulation relating

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to stopping, standing or parking of vehicles and notified in writing by a police officer to appear to answer such charge before the police court, instead of personally appearing in court, may in person or by one duly authorized by him in writing, appear before the clerk of said court, admit the truth of said charge, and pay to said clerk the designated fine; provided that such appearance, admission and payment be made at the office of said clerk during regular business office hours, within five days of such notification and failure to so appear shall be deemed a waiver of the right to dispose of such charge without personal appearance in court.

Any person charged with any of the aforesaid violations relating to stopping, standing or parking of vehicles may elect to mail in the parking violation tag to the Clerk of the Police Court accompanied by payment of the designated fine plus an additional One (\$1.00) Dollar and the name and address of the violator. Such privilege of paying the fine by mail exercised within five (5) days from the date of the offense and the date of depositing of the payment of such fine in a depository maintained by the United States Post Office Department for the collection of mails and the postage cancellation shall be prima facie evidence of the time of deposit. When mail is used for payment of such fine the payment may be in cash or by check or by money order and where payment is attempted with a check drawn against insufficient funds, an additional payment not to exceed Ten (\$10.00) Dollars may be imposed against the violator. When payment is by cash it shall be at the risk of the sender and the record of the Clerk of the Police Court shall be conclusive as to receipt of the same and the amount thereof in absence of written evidence to the contrary.

The payment of the fine to the Clerk as herein provided shall operate as a final disposition of the charge and such proceedings shall not be deemed criminal. Notice of any violation shall indicate the offense charged, the schedule of fines for such violation, the time within which the privilege of paying such fine by mail may be exercised, the place to which such fine may be mailed and such other information as will enable the person charged to take advantage of the provisions of this section.

Notwithstanding anything herein contained the right to dispose of a violation charge relating to stopping, standing or parking of vehicles without personal appearance in Court, may not be exercised by any person who in any consecutive period of twelve months next preceding such charge has been three times in the aggregate adjudged guilty by the police court of any violation of any regulation relating to stopping, standing or parking of vehicles, or has admitted the truth of charges made against him under the provisions of this section.

Sec. 3. This ordinance shall take effect July 1, 1965.

*Be it ordained by the City of Providence:*

SECTION 1. Chapter 1644 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, as approved September 23, 1964, entitled: "An Ordinance Making Appropriation of \$46,159,931.36 for the Support of the City Government for the Fiscal Year Ending September 30, 1965", as amended, is hereby further amended by appropriating the sum of One Hundred Sixty Three Thousand Five Hundred Twenty Five (\$163,525) Dollars to SCHOOL DEPARTMENT.

SECTION 2. The said sum of One Hundred Sixty Three Thousand Five Hundred Twenty Five (\$163,525) Dollars as thus added and appropriated shall be obtained by increasing the estimated receipts from General Departments-Police Department by the sum of One Hundred Fourteen Thousand One Hundred Twenty Five (\$114,125) Dollars and General Departments-Health Department by the sum of Forty Nine Thousand Four Hundred (\$49,400) Dollars.

*Be it ordained by the City of Providence:*

SECTION 1. Chapter 1644 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, as approved September 23, 1964, entitled: "An Ordinance Making Appropriation of \$46,159,931.36 for the Support of the City Government for the Fiscal Year Ending September 30, 1965", as amended, is hereby further amended by appropriating the sum of One Thousand Three Hundred Ten and 85/100 (\$1,310.85) Dollars to STRUCTURES AND ZONING DIVISION.

SECTION 2. The said sum of One Thousand Three Hundred Ten and 85/100 (\$1,310.85) Dollars as thus added and appropriated shall be obtained by authorizing and directing the City Controller and City Treasurer to transfer a like amount from the Reserve for Extraordinary Expenditures Account to the Receipt Account.

SECTION 3. The estimated receipts from the Reserve for Extraordinary Expenditures Account are hereby increased by One Thousand Three Hundred Ten and 85/100 (\$1,310.85) Dollars.

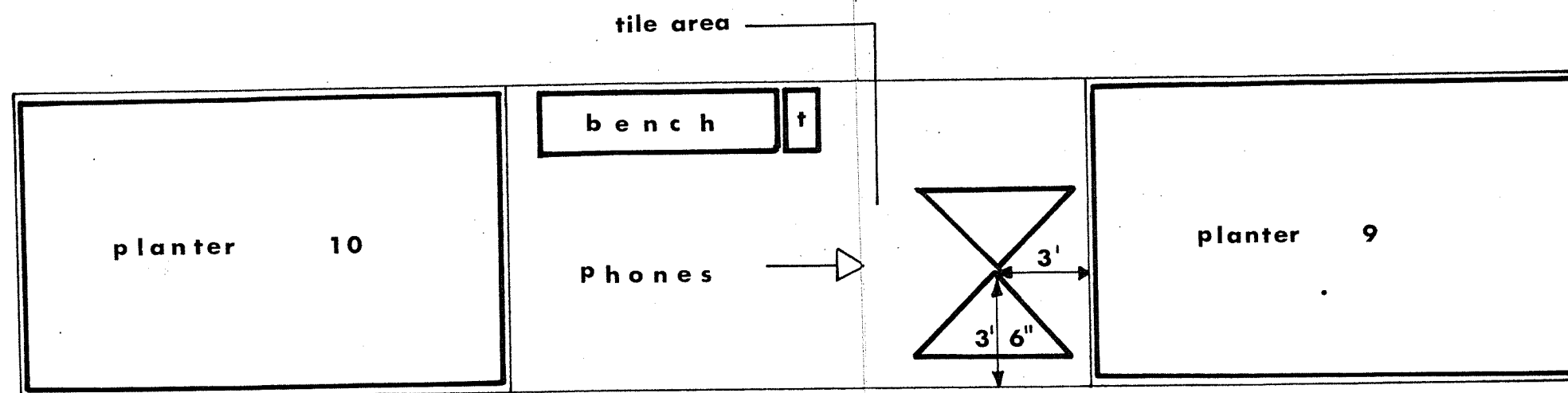
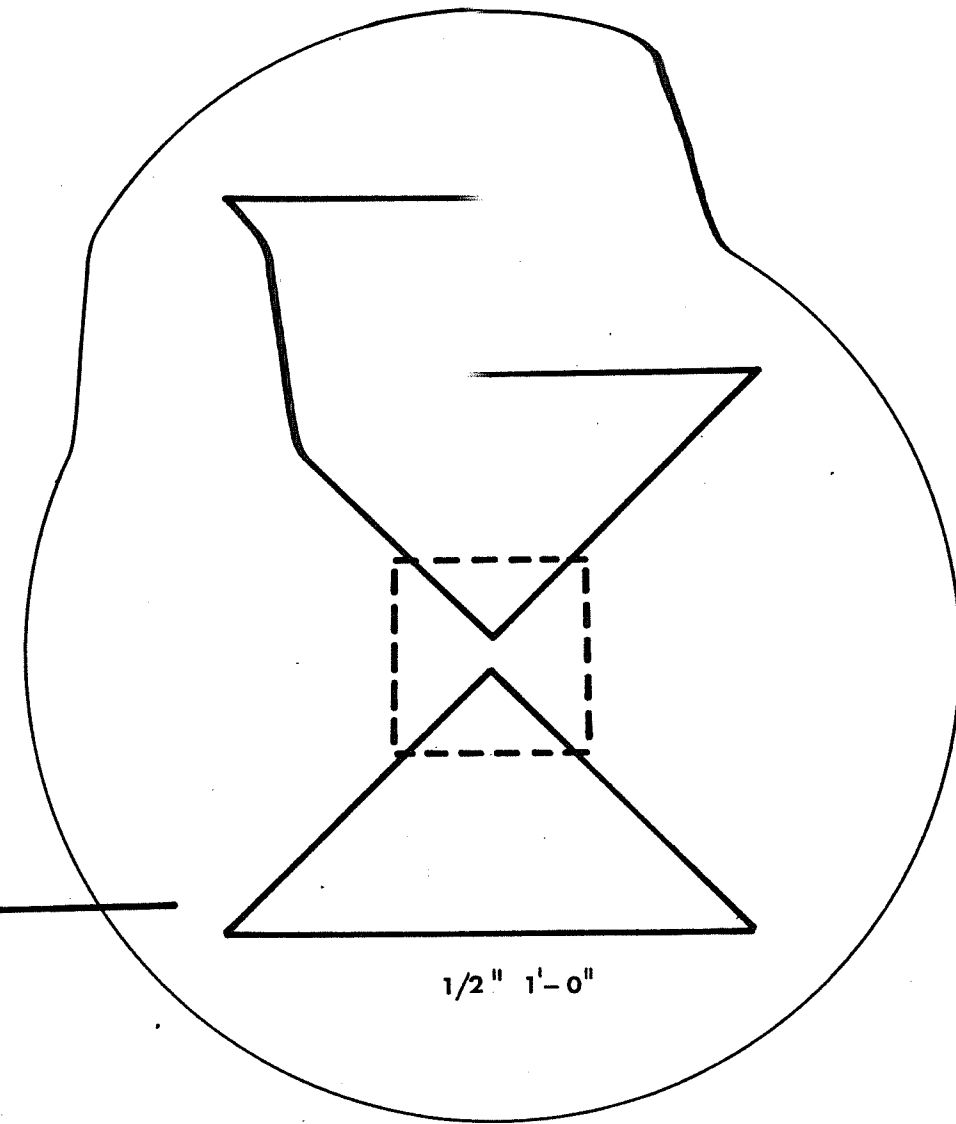

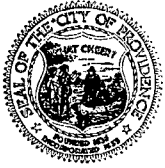

Dear Mr. Payne:

As you may know, the Westminster Pedestrian Mall was designed without the telephone facilities. At the beginning of this year the New England Telephone Company requested us to determine whether outdoor telephones of a new type could be provided on the Mall. We checked all available locations and found that there is one spot at the approximate midpoint of the Mall where two phones of the type suggested by the Company could be placed.

The upper end of the Mall is served by an existing telephone booth on the property of B. A. Dario. The Dorrance Street end of the Mall might be served by a telephone to be located on private property. Arrangements for this, of course, would be between the Telephone Company and the owner of the property.

It is my recommendation that City Council approval be limited to the location agreed upon between the Company and the City at this time, specifically between planter 9 and planter 10, as shown on the attached drawing.
