



SUBJECT: Resolution requesting the Traffic Engineer to replace any and all Crosswalks in front of all schools, recreation centers, senior citizens centers, all high rises and multi-service centers.

The DPW-Traffic Engineering Division has investigated this request and has the following to offer:

Pavement marking work is performed as funding becomes available. The crosswalks for all the schools were done in 2006 with five year Epoxy paint. The longevity of the paint depends on the excessive wear and tear that occurs to the roads during the winter months with snow removal operations. Many of the streets in city are missing pavement markings and we try to prioritize the areas that will get painted as funds become available. The budget for pavement markings is too small to paint every location that is in need. Do to the fact that we are not aware of the locations of all the senior citizens centers, high rises and multi-service centers. It would be helpful if a list of the locations in question could be provided to DPW-Traffic Engineering so we can require these locations and add them to the list of priorities when funding becomes available.
