In complying with the ordinances of the City of Providence, the Board of Park Commissioners present the following report of the North Burial Ground for the year 1975.

During the year 1975 the sum of \$2,999.00 was received for Perpetual Care of Lots and Single Graves.

During the year 1975 there were 293 interments making a total of 66,108 since 1848, that being the first year that records of interments were kept.

109 foundations for headstones or monuments were built.

There were 27 Lots placed under Perpetual Care and 39 Single Graves placed under Perpetual Care.

The present number of Lots under Annual Care, 6.

Number of Lots now held in Perpetual Trust, 317.

The average number of employees during the year was 12.
