

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Approved

WHEREAS, the number of public welfare recipients and the costs of public welfare in the City of Providence has been increasing despite the drastic decline of the City's population and relative prosperity of the times, and

WHEREAS, approximately 50% of the entire State's recipients of public welfare live or have moved into Providence despite the fact that the City's population is only about 25% of that of the State, and

WHEREAS, the State of Rhode Island pays for and should provide all the administration and social workers for all public welfare programs except that of public assistance, and

WHEREAS, many able bodied persons and recipients of the public assistance program while many job opportunities remained unfilled, the Park Department is shorthanded, public buildings remain unrepaired and unpainted, and the services of such recipients might well be put to good use,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the Finance Committee of the City Council hold a public hearing concerning the practices and procedures of the Providence Public Welfare Department, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That said Finance Committee undertake to study and recommend such changes, reforms and improvements it deems advisable to improve the practices and procedures of the said Public Welfare Department, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Director of Public Welfare provide such statistics, data and assistance to the Finance Committee, as it may request.

CHAPTER

No. **AN ORDINANCE** BARRING CORRUPT PRACTICES, DUAL
OFFICE HOLDING AND POLITICAL ACTIVITY BY CITY
EMPLOYEES.

*Approved****Be it ordained by the City of Providence:***

Section 1. No employee, who is not elected to his
office, of said City shall:

1. Solicit contributions of money, property and/or
services for any political party, campaign, and/or
candidate;
2. Be a candidate for political office whether it be
School Committee, municipal office or state office;
3. Hold more than one public office at the same time
unless expressly permitted by majority vote of the
City Council.

Section 2. Any employee violating the provisions of
this Ordinance shall:

1. Be immediately dismissed from employment by the
City, and
2. Not subject to re-employment.


