Now, Therefore, Be It Ordained By the City of Providence:

Section 1. To defray the expenses of the City of Providence for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1991, the sums of money or so much thereof, as are authorized by law, indicated in the accompanying schedule, are hereby appropriated for the objects and purposes, and in amounts expressed therein provided that payments thereunder shall be subject to the provisions of the Home Rule Charter of 1980, validated by the General Assembly of the State of Rhode Island at its January Session, A.D., 1981 and approved November 4, 1980, and subject to the provisions of the City Ordinances relative to the expenditures of money from the City Treasury. Fiscal Assistance to State and Local Government rules and regulations shall govern the portion of this Budget so designated.

Section 2. The payments to the School Fund of the following estimated receipts included in the appropriation of \$109,423,937.00 for the support of the Public Schools for the City of Providence fiscal period 1990-1991, will be increased or decreased to conform with the actual amounts received from such sources during the City of Providence fiscal year 1990-1991.

Section 3. Any transfer to the General Fund from Expendable Trust Funds shall be restricted to and deemed to be utilized for the payment of principal on debt obligations of the City of Providence.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

department which is in excess of the total number of positions or the number of any individual class of positions provided herein for the particular department, provided; however, that with the approval of the department head and the Director of Finance, said maximum may be exceeded temporarily when regular employees are absent on vacation and the excess employees do not aggregate more than the number on vacation or during the absence of employees due to injuries received while discharging their duties as employees, or during absences of employees on sick leave and it is necessary to employ temporary employees for the duration of the employees sick leave, or during the absence of employees who have been granted a temporary leave of absence, or when in the opinion of the Director of Finance, a temporary emergency exists.

Sec. 61. Where no maximum limit is fixed on the total number of positions or the number of any individual class of position in a department,

the number of persons appointed and employees shall be determined by the unexpended appropriation available.

Sec. 62. Chapter 1989-14 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence approved June 22, 1989, with all amendments and additions thereto, is hereby repealed and all other Ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent herewith, are likewise repealed.

Sec. 63. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

An Ordinance establishing a compensation plan for the city of Providence and repealing Ordinance Chapter 1989-13, approved June 22, 1989, as amended.

Section 1. The aforescribed Compensation Plan is hereby adopted for all City Officers and employees and shall be applied to each, except as hereinafter described.

In order to provide for periodic increases, each position is categorized as one (1) of thirty-five (35) "Pay Grades", each of which contains five (5) steps.

Section 2. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Ordinance, any and all employees in the Office of the Mayor shall be excepted from any salary established herein so long as the total of the compensation for such employees does not exceed the annual budget appropriation for personal services in the Office of the Mayor.

Section 3. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Ordinance, the compensation for positions approved by the Salary Review Board and legal assistants to the City Solicitor shall be no greater than those herein specified; however, any department head or legal assistant to the City Solicitor may be compensated at a rate lower than

Section 4. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this Ordinance, the compensation for all City Officers and City Employees contained in this Ordinance, which are herein denoted by an asterisk (*) shall remain at the same level of Compensation as they receive on June 30, 1990 and any increase in compensation shall not be effective until October 1, 1990.

Section 5. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Ordinance, the Compensation for all City Officers and City Employees contained in this Ordinance, which are herein denoted by an asterisk (*) shall in no case be less than Ninety percentum (90%) of the total amount of compensation for said position.

Section 6. This Ordinance shall take effect July 1, 1990.

An Ordinance Providing for the Assessment and Collection of 1990 Taxes in a Sum Not Less than One Hundred Fifty Million, Eight Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$150,800,000.00) and Not More than One Hundred Seventy-Three Million, Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$173,500,000.00) being Based on One Hundred Percent (100%) of the 1990-1991 Fiscal Year Tax Collection, as amended.

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

Section 1. The City Council of the City of Providence hereby orders the assessment and collection of a tax on the ratable real estate and tangible personal property as well as orders the assessment and collection of an excise tax on all registered motor vehicles, in a sum not less than One Hundred Fifty Million Eight Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$150,800,000.00) and not more than One Hundred Seventy-three

Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$173,500,000.00) being based on One Hundred Percent (100%) of the 1990-1991 Fiscal Year tax collection, as amended; said tax is for ordinary expense charges for the payment of interest and indebtedness in whole or in part of said City and for other purposes authorized by law.

Section 2. The City Assessor shall assess and apportion said tax on inhabitants and ratable real estate and tangible personal property of said City as of the 31st day of December, A.D. 1989 at midnight, Eastern Standard Time, as well as assess and apportion said excise tax on the owners of registered motor vehicles in the City of Providence during calendar year 1989, according to law, and shall on completion of said assessment, date and sign the same, and shall make out and certify to the City Collector of the City of Providence on or before the 15th day of June, A.D. 1990, a complete list containing (1) the names of persons taxed and the total value of all the real estate taxed to each person; (2) the amount of personal estate except manufacturers' machinery and equipment assessed against each person; and (3) the amount of the motor vehicle excise assessment against each person on said real estate, personal estate and motor vehicle opposite the name of the person or persons assessed.

The assessment of real estate and personal estate shall appear in separate columns on said list. The assessment of motor vehicles shall appear on a separate list.

Said taxes shall be due and payable on and between the 1st day of July, 1990 next, and the Twenty-Fifth day of July, A.D. 1990 next, and all taxes remaining unpaid on said last named day shall carry until collected, a penalty at the rate of twelve (12%) percentum per annum upon such unpaid real estate, personal estate and excise taxes.

Provided, however said taxes may be paid in four installments, the first installment of

Twenty-Five (25%) percentum on or before the Twenty-Fifth day of July A.D. 1990 next, and the remaining installments as follows: Twenty-Five (25%) percentum on the Twenty-Fourth day of October A.D. 1990, Twenty-Five (25%) percentum on the Twenty-Fourth day of January A.D. 1991, and Twenty-Five (25%) percentum on the Twenty-Fourth day of April A.D. 1991. Each installment of taxes, if paid on or before the last day of each installment period successively and in order, shall be free from any charges for interest. Provided, however, the option to pay taxes in quarterly installments shall not apply to any tax levied in an amount not in excess of \$50. If the first installment, or any succeeding installment of taxes, is not paid by the last day of the respective installment period or periods as they occur, then the whole tax or remaining unpaid balance of the tax, as the case may be, shall immediately become due and payable and shall carry, until collected, a penalty at the rate of twelve (12%) percentum per annum on said real estate, personal estate, and excise taxes.

The City Collector, shall by advertisement in a public newspaper of the City, notify all persons assessed to pay their respective taxes at his office on and between the said 1st and Twenty-Fifth day of July A.D. 1990 both days inclusive; said Collector shall attend daily during said periods, Saturdays, Sundays, and Holidays excepted, at his office from Eight-Thirty o'clock A.M. to Four o'clock P.M. to receive taxes.

Section 3. This Ordinance is enacted pursuant to Rhode Island General Laws 44-5-2(c).

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

An Ordinance in amendment of Sec. 17-28 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Providence, entitled: "Assignment of Police Officers to Construction Projects".

Be it Ordained by the City of Providence:

Section 1. Assignment of Police Officers to Construction Project. The Chief of Police, or his designee, shall have the power and authority to assign police officers to any road construction projects or any other assignment at the request of any person, business or corporation within the City of Providence when it is determined by him that such an assignment is necessary for the public safety.

The officers so assigned will be paid for such duty by the contractor in accordance with the schedule of charges in effect by the City of Providence. Further, the contractor shall, in addition, be responsible to pay to the City of Providence, any administrative charges directly related to the expenses incurred by the City of Providence in providing the officer to the contractor.

Section 2. If any clause or portion of this Ordinance shall be deemed unconstitutional, it shall not affect any other portion or clause of the Ordinance.
