CITY OF PROVIDENCE, RHODE ISLAND

I would like to submit the following resolution to the City Council.

A recent change in the traffic flow occasioned by construction on Promenade Street has resulted in the creation of extremely dangerous traffic conditions for those citizens attempting to cross Promenade Street on their way to work at the CIC Complex.

Traffic on both sides of the Woonasquatucket River travels at speeds above average and further compounds the problem each morning and afternoon for the many people going to their cars and taking the bus.

This problem is being called to your attention in an effort to have crosswalks painted on Promenade Street and Kinsley Avenue directly in front of the wooden foot bridge adjacent to the Merchants Cold Storage and Warehouse Company at 160 Kinsley Avenue.

It is requested that crosswalks and yield to pedestrian signs be installed without delay in an effort to alleviate this dangerous situation which could result in serious injury or even a possible fatality on a Providence Street.
