

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 498

Approved September 9, 1994

RESOLVED, That the Traffic Engineer is requested to approve certain traffic patterns in the vicinity of Brown University commencing Wednesday, September 7, 1994, and ending Monday, September 12, 1994, and to prohibit motor vehicle traffic along various streets surrounding the Wriston-Keeney Quad Areas to accommodate the Freshman Orientation Program as follows:

September 7-8, 1994

Wriston-Keeney Quad Areas:

- a) George Street, One-Way East from Magee Street to Thayer Street
- b) Charlesfield Street, One-Way West from Thayer Street to Brown Street.
- c) Benevolent Street, One Way East from Magee Street to Brown Street.
- d) Brown Street, One-Way North from Charlesfield Street to George Street.
- e) Post and enforce "No Parking" on the west side of Magee Street from George Street to Benevolent Street.



Pembroke Area:


- a) Post south side of Bowen Street, from Thayer Street to Brown Street "No Parking Anytime".

September 12, 1994:

On Monday, September 12, 1994, The Opening Convocation will be held. In order to facilitate the safe movement of students on College Street, from Benefit Street east through the Van Wickle Gates onto the college Green, permission is requested to block off vehicular traffic on the following streets between 10:00 o'clock A.M. and 11:30 o'clock A.M. on that date only:

- a) College Street, from Benefit Street east to the Van Wickle Gates at Prospect Street.
- b). Prospect Street, from Waterman Street to George Street.

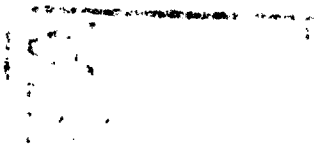

Dear Mr. Clarkin:

The Freshman Orientation Program at Brown University begins on Wednesday, September 7, 1994 and ends with the Opening Convocation on Monday, September 12, 1994 the first day of classes.

SEPTEMBER 7-8, 1994

With the majority of students arriving on September 7 and September 8, I am requesting approval for the following traffic pattern on those dates to deal with congestion around the University area:

1. Wriston-Keeney Quad areas:
 - a) George Street one-way east from Magee to Thayer.
 - b) Charlesfield Street one-way west from Thayer to Brown Street.
 - c) Benevolent Street one-way east from Magee to Brown Street.
 - d) Brown Street one-way north from Charlesfield to George Street.
 - e) Post and enforce "NO PARKING" on the west side of Megee Street from George To Benevolent St.

2. Pembroke area:
 - a) Post south side of Bowen Street from Thayer to Brown Street "NO PARKING ANYTIME".

This traffic pattern should be established by 6:00 AM, on these days and we will provide officers to control points by 7:00 AM. The pattern should remain in effect until 6:00 PM on the above dates. Additionally, I would request that parking restrictions/tagging be lifted on most streets adjacent to the campus during this two day period.

August 23 - 25

Brown Street, from Benevolent Street to George Street

Charlesfield Street, from 37 Charlesfield Street (Construction Gate) to Thayer Street

George Street, from 114 George Street to Thayer Street

Thayer Street, from 117 Thayer Street to Charlesfield Street

August 29 - 31

Charlesfield Street, from 37 Charlesfield Street (Construction Gate) to Thayer Street

George Street, from 114 George Street to Thayer Street

Also, post "No Parking on Either Side" Signs beginning at 2300 hours Monday, August 22, 1994 through 11:00 o'clock P.M. on Thursday, August 25, 1994 and again beginning at 2300 hours on Sunday, August 28, 1994 through 11:00 o'clock P.M. on Wednesday, August 31, 1994.
