

REPORT OF SPECIAL COMMITTEE  
TO STUDY FACILITIES AT  
TRIGGS MEMORIAL GOLF COURSE

To The Honorable The City Council of the City of Providence.

Gentlemen:

Your Committee created by Resolution 91 approved February 6, 1959 for the purpose of studying existing facilities at Triggs Memorial Golf Course, respectfully reports:

Several meetings were held with protracted discussions having taken place. The first meeting was held at the Office of the Superintendent of Parks in Roger Williams Park at which time John R. Flynn, Chairman and Joseph Castronovo, M. D., member of the Board of Park Commissioners and Martin F. Noonan, Superintendent of Parks and your Committee were present.

Discussion on the provisions of the Resolution ensued and it was the consensus of the meeting a new schedule of fees be envoked to compensate for the proposed improvements and costs of maintenance - a schedule of which is incorporated in this Committee's record.

Your Committee at a subsequent meeting invited Harold Parks, Manager of Triggs Memorial Golf Course to attend and accepted his recommendations as follows:

1. Grass tees be built in batteries of threes' in locations which would be easiest to maintain and that a watering system be installed to eliminate the use of hoses for irrigation.

2. Creation of a nursery for grass sod and plantings for exclusive use on the course; restrict the movement of caddy carts at the approaches to the greens by employing ground oyster shells and signs denoting restricted areas;

3. Utilize dump area to store fill for future use;

4. Construct concrete bridges to replace existing wooden ones thus eliminating the necessity of frequent replacement;

5. Construct ramps in place of stairs;

6. Engage four Rangers to be uniformed and provide motor vehicles, jeeps, if procureable, to patrol the course;

7. Increase parking facility by expanding from present principal area over a portion of the practice driving range;

8. Construct asphalt walks to replace present dirt pedestrian paths around clubhouse and to first tee;

9. Improve main entrance by enlarging same and embellishing area;

10. Asphalt tile covering for the floors in the locker room and shower room, or those portions thereof normally used by patrons;

11. Increase size of greens;

Holes 9, 18, 6, 2, 14, 15, 7, 5, 17, 10, 8 and 1 (Areas averages 2000 square feet).

Holes 3, 16, 13 and 11 (Areas averages 3000 square feet.)

Hole 4 and putting green (Areas averages 5000 square feet.)

12. Putting Green.

Install a second putting green to eliminate the necessity of closing this one existing green during the week to preserve it from use by heavy play;

13. Starting regulations - continue present plan which was inaugurated in advance of this report in the interest of time;

14. Acquire the following equipment to continue maintenance work:

Trade the International Tractor for a Ford rear, power take-off, 3 point hitch on rear;

15. Sixth and Fourth Holes, convert these fairways (portions) to water hazards;

16. Construct a Pro Shop at the first tee, so that the Pro may be employed as a starter and/or caddy master.

With reference to golf tournaments, your Committee suggests the allocation of Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars from current revenue, which revenue will, based on estimates, be approximately Twenty Thousand (\$20,000.00) Dollars more than last years, to a City of Providence Open Golf Tournament in order to fulfil the provisions of the Resolution.

With particular reference to Mr. Harold Parks, your Committee is expressly mindful of the progress made at Triggs Golf Course on improvements already completed and proposed and further recommends a permanent supervisory status be granted him as manager of this course with authority to put into effect his impressions of improvements not inconsistent with good municipal practices and within the authority that may be granted by the Board of Park Commissioners, and payment of a salary commensurate with said position and duties.

Your Committee in presenting this report is mindful of the time required to complete such a program and improvements and <sup>will</sup> make further progress reports and recommendations.

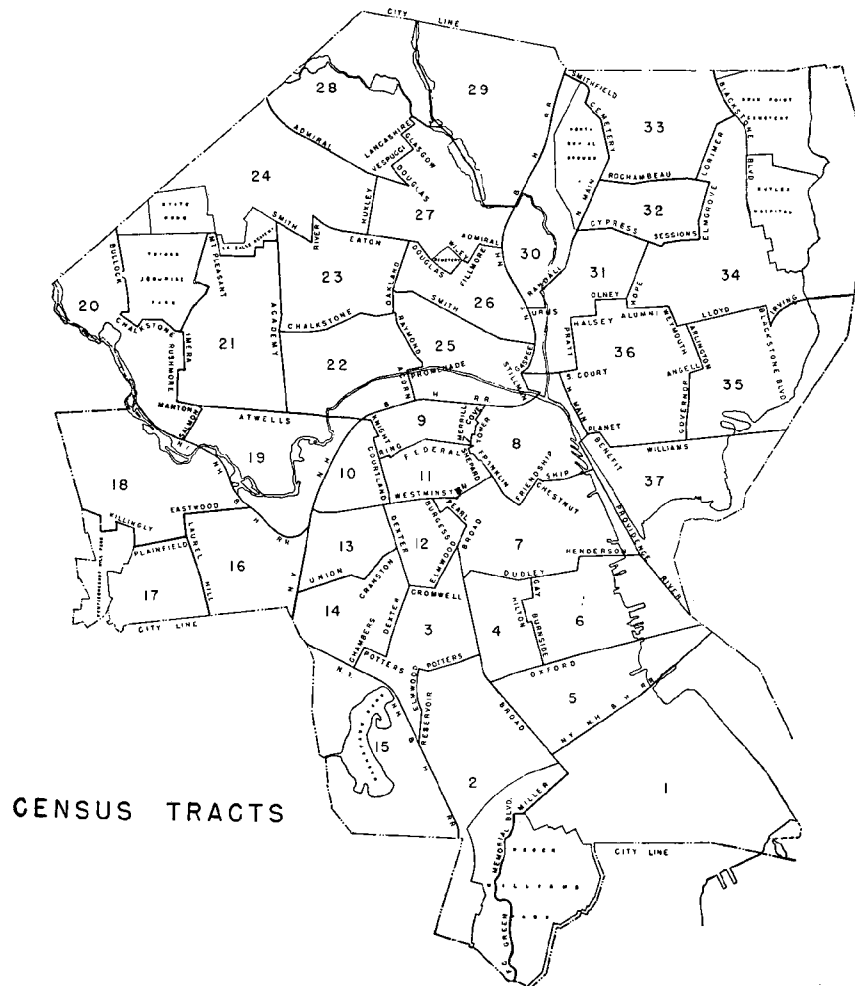
