
Dear Councilman Matera:

Under date of April 27, 1964, we forwarded to your Committee a copy of a letter which we received from Edwards and Angell, attorneys for the Rhode Island Hospital, regarding the possibility of abandoning Lockwood Street from Plain Street to Hospital Street. We also enclosed a copy of our letter to the Water Supply Board dated April 24, 1964 showing the cost of relocating the 20" feeder that is presently located in Lockwood Street to be \$56,658. At the direction of the Water Supply Board a copy of the letter to the Board was forwarded to Edwards and Angell.

Quite some time ago, Mr. Oliver Pratt, Executive Vice President of the Hospital, conferred in this office when the Rhode Island Hospital first contemplated the abandonment of Lockwood Street. It was explained to Mr. Pratt that this important feeder could not be abandoned without disrupting a wide area of our distribution system. It would affect the service to the Narragansett Electric Company and curtail the flow of water for general use as well as fire protection to the Base Side and Fox Point sections of Providence. We informed Mr. Pratt the cost of relocating the 20" feeder in Plain Street, Borden Street and Service Road #1 would have to be borne by the Rhode Island Hospital.

We respectfully request that your Committee consider withholding action on this proposed abandonment until the Rhode Island Hospital files a check in the amount of \$56,658 with Mr. Philip Pitassi, City Collector, to cover the cost of relocating the present main in Lockwood Street so that it will be installed in Plain Street, Borden Street and Service Road #1.

Gentlemen:

The State has no objection to the abandonment of Lockwood Street between Plainfield and Hospital Streets. The abutting parcels at the Hospital Street corners are parcels 2 and 3 of state condemnation plat 1074 and parcel 10 state condemnation plat 1080. Technically these areas in the related streets are covered by the general covenants of the condemnation but are not within the established taking lines. Obviously with the discontinuance of Lockwood Street the perogatives in the street serve no useful State highway purpose.

It is my understanding that there is in process of reversion to the Rhode Island Hospital of the remnants of parcel 3 which was formerly owned by the hospital. Likewise, a part of parcel 10 plat 1080 may no longer be needed for highway purposes and could be treated in the same manner. Hence would it not be possible to include with such transactions the release by the State of all claim to the Lockwood Street rights if any?

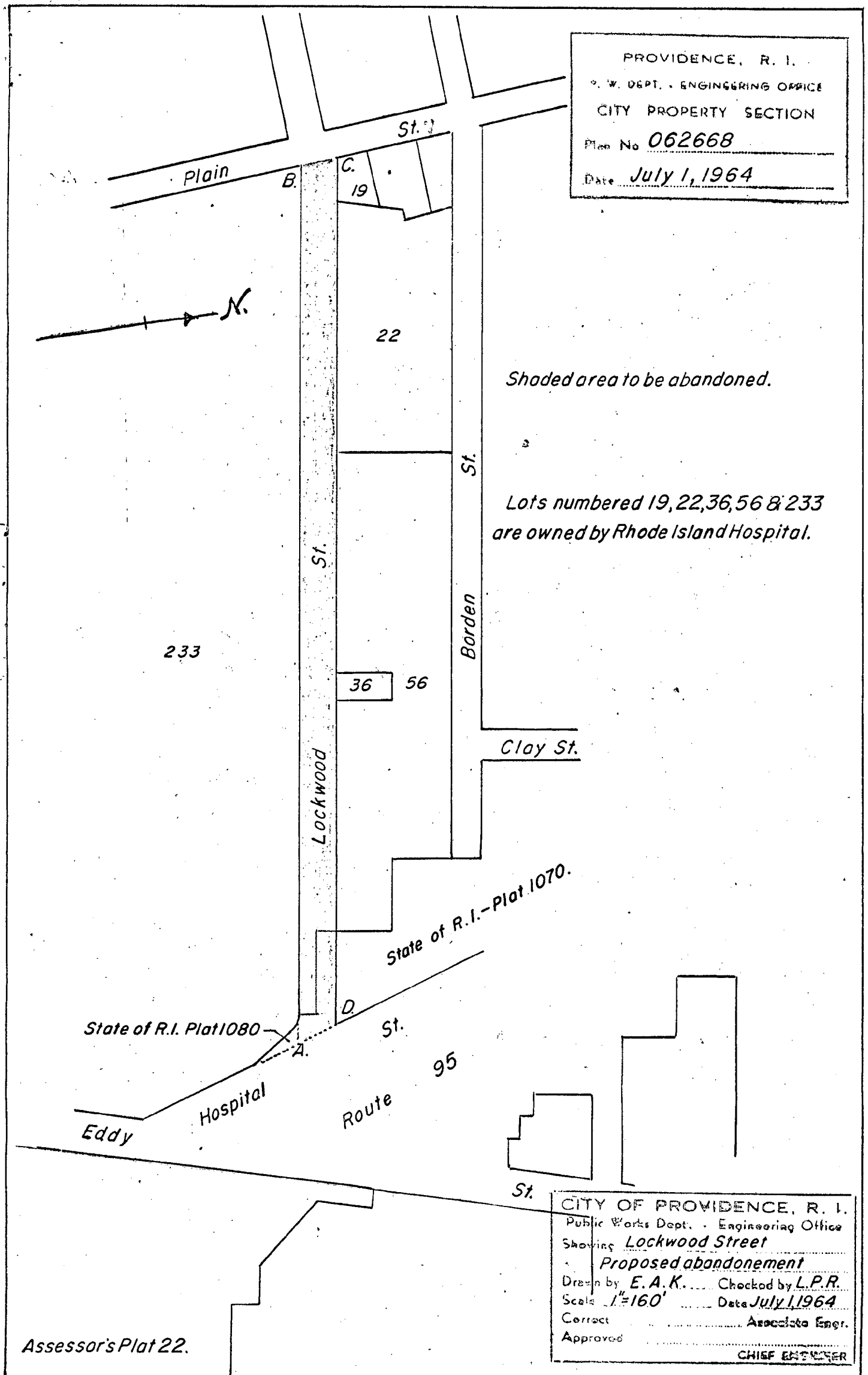

Dear Councilman Matera:

Under date of July 8, 1964, we received an official memorandum from the City Clerk's Office regarding the proposed abandonment of Lockwood Street, Cory Street and Barclay Street. The Lockwood Street abandonment was petitioned for by the R. I. Hospital and we sent a letter to the Committee on July 14 requesting that your Committee consider withholding favorable action on this until the R. I. Hospital deposits a check in the amount of \$56,658 to cover the cost of replacing the present main in Lockwood Street with a new main in Plain Street, Borden Street and Service Road #1.

The other two streets, Cory and Barclay Streets, were petitioned for abandonment by the Housing Authority of the City of Providence. The depreciated value of our facilities in these two streets follow:



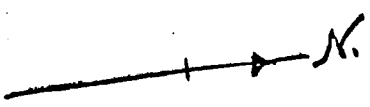

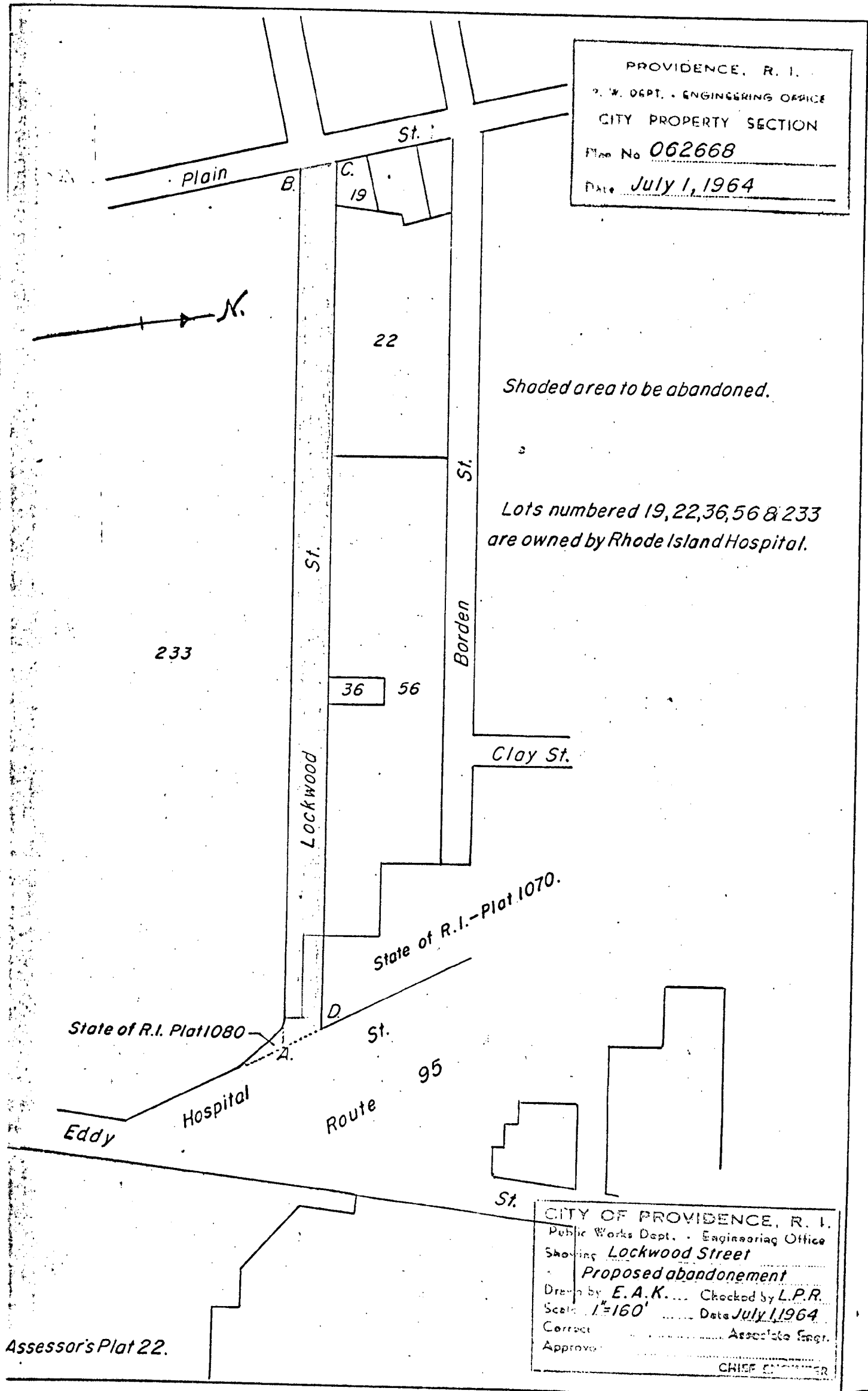

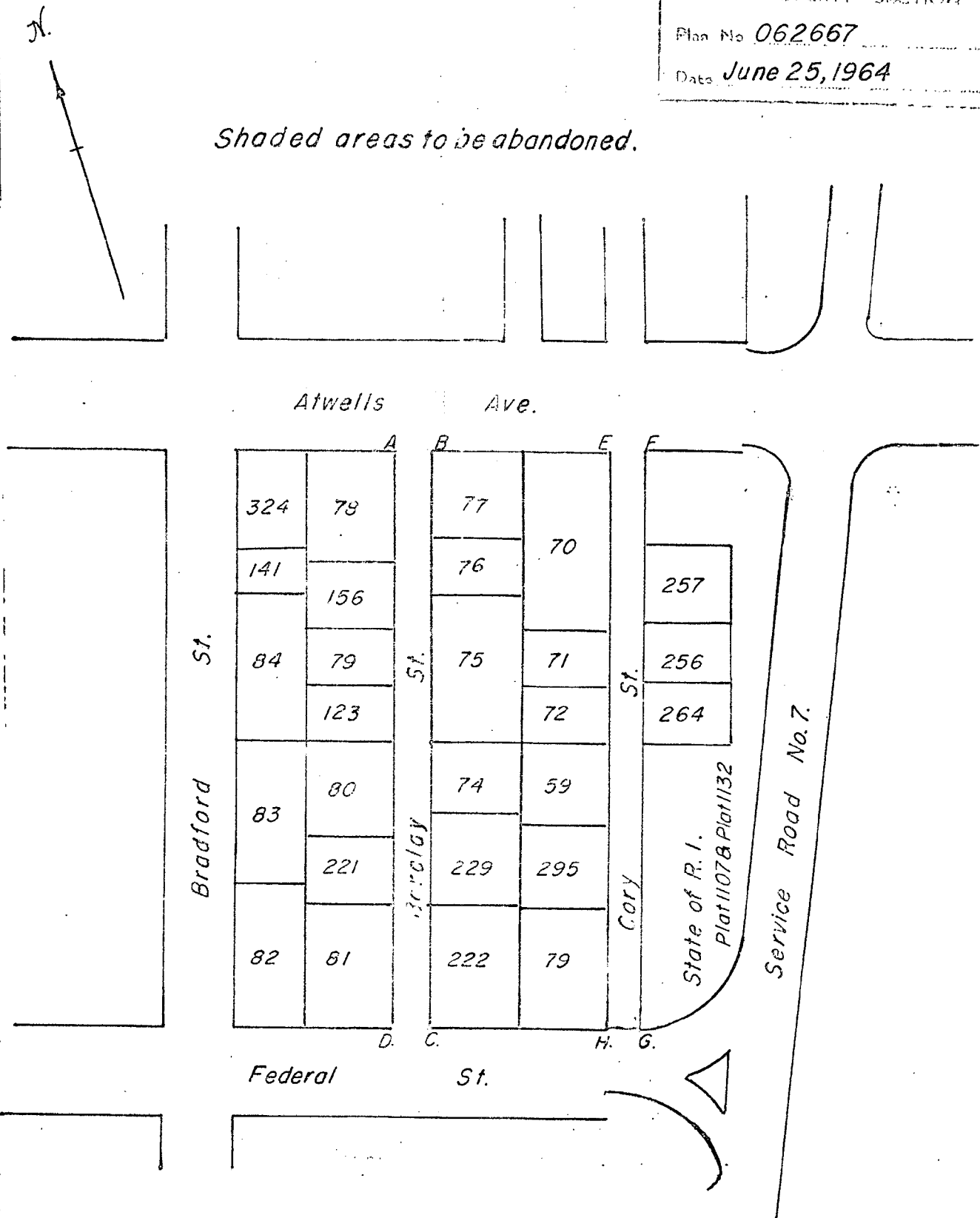
