RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

WHEREAS, Joseph R. Paolino, Jr., began his career in public service as a Member of the Providence Historic District commission at the age of nineteen. He went on to serve as an Administrative Assistant to Lieutenant Governor, Thomas R. DiLuglio, and

WHEREAS, At the age of twenty-three, Joe Paolino was elected to the Providence City Council, representing the Federal Hill and West Broadway Neighborhoods. Four years later, he was elected by his colleagues as President of the City Council, and

WHEREAS, The duties of Mayor of Providence were thrust upon Joe Paolino when he was twenty-nine years of age. He steered the City through a difficult period and set about the business of creating an agenda for the future. This agenda included regular meetings with residents of all City neighborhoods, the renovation of City Schools and Parks, the relocation of the major rivers in the City and the revitalization of Downtown Providence as a cultural and retail center for the entire State, and

WHEREAS, Joseph Paolino went on to be appointed Director of the Rhode Island Department of Economic Development by Governor Bruce G. Sundlun. In this capacity, he highlighted the importance of economic development by protecting small business, helping businesses expand and enticing companies to locate in Rhode Island, and

WHEREAS, During these busy years, Joe and his lovely wife, Lianne, were also raising a young family. They are the proud parents of Jennifer, Christina, Jacqueline and Joseph III, and

WHEREAS, Joseph R. Paolino, Jr., has been appointed United States Ambassador to the Republic of Malta,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Members of the City Council express immense pride in our former colleague for the honor he has brought to himself, to his family and to the City of Providence. We have every confidence that the human relations and diplomatic skills that he learned on Federal Hill and in Providence City Hall will serve him well in the International Arena, and




WHEREAS, The Religious Sisters of Mercy (R.S.M.) have been in Providence for 150 years, and
