No. 261 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE, CHAPTER 1714, BY APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF TWO HUNDRED (\$200.00) DOLLARS TO THE RHODE ISLAND STATE DEPARTMENT, FRANCO-AMERICAN WAR VETERANS, INC., CONVENTION COMMITTEE.

Approved May 10, 1966

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

SECTION 1. Chapter 1714 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence as approved September 17, 1965, entitled: "An Ordinance Making Appropriation of \$48,330,160.85 for the Support of the City Government for the Fiscal Year Ending September 30, 1966", as amended, is hereby further amended by appropriating the sum of Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars to the RHODE ISLAND STATE DEPARTMENT, FRANCO-AMERICAN WAR VETERANS, INC., CONVENTION COMMITTEE.

SECTION 2. The money hereby appropriated shall be paid to the Treasurer of the 1966 Rhode Island State Department, Franco-American War Veterans, Inc., Convention Committee to help defray the expenses of the Department Convention to be held in the City of Providence on May 20th, 21st and 22nd, 1966.

SECTION 3. The said sum of Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars as hereby appropriated shall be charged to the General Fund from Funds Not Otherwise Appropriated.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

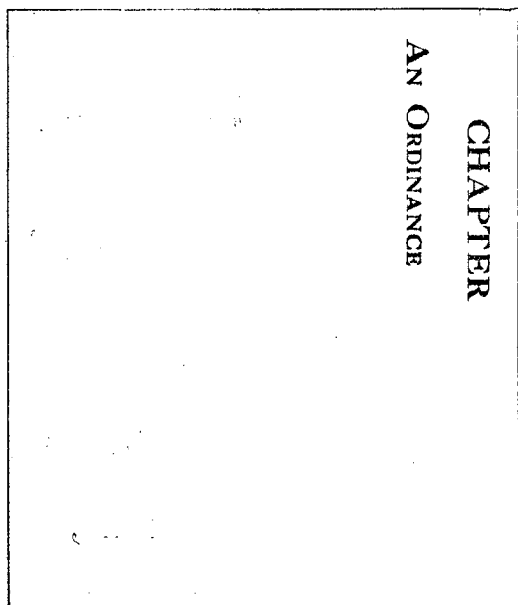

RESOLVED, That His Honor, the Mayor, be and he hereby is authorized to execute a conveyance to the Jewish Community Center of Providence, a non-profit Rhode Island corporation, or its nominee, of the westerly portion of Lot 7 on City Assessor's Plat 7, known as the Sessions Street Playground, bounding westerly on Elmgrove Avenue, bounding northerly on land now or lately of Brown University, bounding easterly in part on land of the City of Providence and in part on land now or lately of the Jewish Community Center of Providence and bounding southerly on Sessions Street, said premises containing eighty four thousand (84,000) square feet of land more or less, and being the westerly portion of that certain plat entitled, "Providence, R. I. City Engineer's Office, City Property Department, May 5, 1966, No. 062974" and that

His Honor, the Mayor, is hereby authorized as consideration for the conveyance hereinbefore described to receive for recreation purposes a conveyance from the Jewish Community Center of Providence of Lot 151 on City Assessor's Plat 7, as said Plat stands April 18, 1966, said Lot 151 containing approximately seventy thousand eight hundred twenty-nine (70,829) square feet of land, together with all improvements thereon, and

Be it further resolved that the said conveyances by the City of Providence and the Jewish Community Center of Providence shall contain the following agreements:

1. That the Jewish Community Center of Providence agrees to cause the buildings and improvements presently existing on its premises, Lot 151 on City Assessor's Plat 7, to be removed, and to reconstruct athletic fields for the benefit of the City of Providence, of the same type as those now in existence on said Session Street Playground to be laid out in accordance with plans of the Department of Recreation of said City, all at the expense of the said Jewish Community Center of Providence, and

2. That the JEWISH COMMUNITY CENTER of Providence covenants that the premises it shall receive by deed shall be used for its corporate purposes as a community center only; and should the corporation cease to exist or should the land no longer be used for corporate purposes, then the City of Providence shall have the right of first refusal of purchase at a price not to exceed the then fair market value.

3. That the City of Providence covenants that the balance of said area known as Sessions Street Playground and the area it shall receive by deed shall be used for recreation purposes only; and should this land or any portion thereof no longer be used for recreation purposes, then the Jewish Community Center of Providence shall have the right of first refusal of purchase at a price not to exceed the then fair market value.

4. That the Jewish Community Center and the City of Providence agree to use their best efforts during the period of construction of the new center to provide auxiliary ballfields and playground area to the end that recreational opportunities will not be substantially reduced in the area.

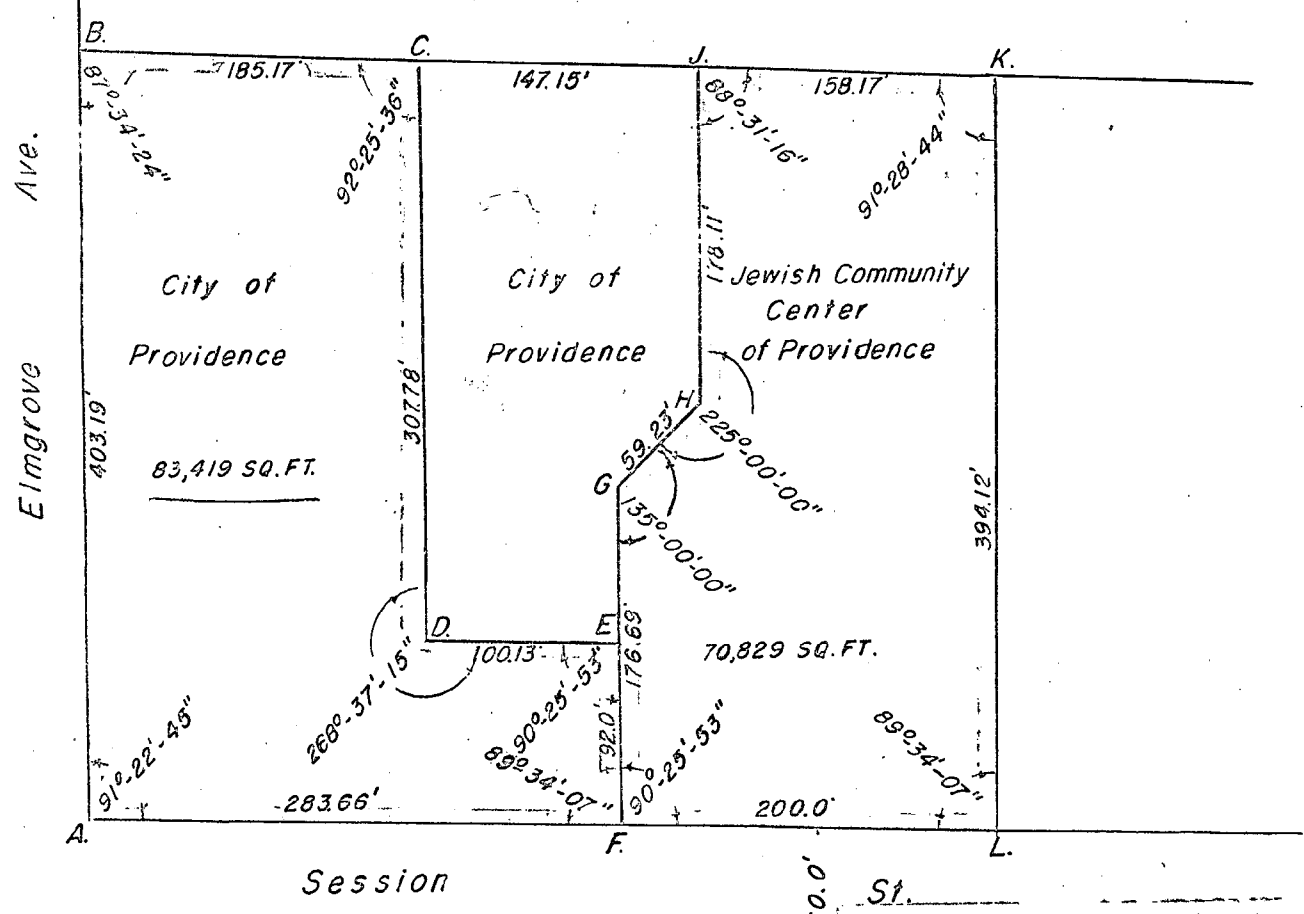

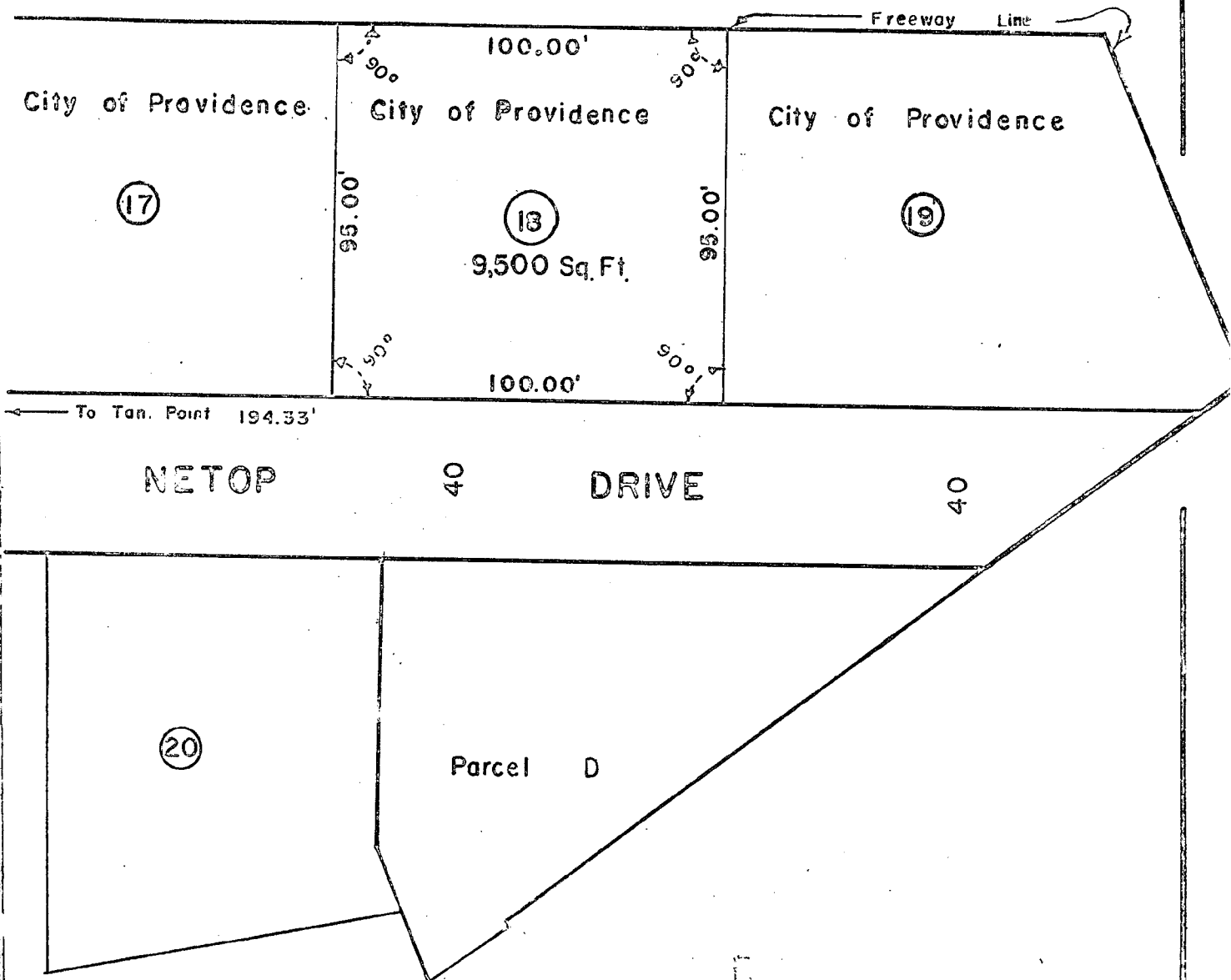

Approved May 10, 1966

RESOLVED,

That the City Council of the City of Providence hereby orders the assessment and collection of a tax on the ratable real estate and tangible personal property and ratable intangible personal property (the tax on ratable intangible property to be at the rate of forty cents on each one hundred dollars of the value thereof) in a sum not less than \$30,500,000 nor more than \$32,000,000; said tax is for ordinary expenses, charges and sinking funds, for the payment of interest and indebtedness in whole or in part of said City, and for other purposes authorized by law.

The City Assessor shall assess and apportion said tax on the inhabitants and ratable property of said City as of the 31st day of December, A. D. 1965, at twelve o'clock, noon, Eastern Standard Time according to law, and shall on completion of said assessment, date and sign the same, and shall make out and certify to the City Collector of the City of Providence, on or before the 15th day of June, A. D. 1966, a complete list of the names of the persons taxed and of the total value of all the real estate taxes to each person, also the amount of personal estate assessed against each person, and also the total amount of the tax assessed against each person on said real estate and personal estate, opposite the name of the person or persons assessed, the assessment of real estate and of personal estate to appear in separate columns in said list. Said tax shall be due and payable on and between the 1st day of October, next and the twenty-fourth day of October, A. D. 1966, next, and all taxes remaining unpaid on said last named day shall carry until collected a penalty at the rate of eight percentum per annum upon such unpaid taxes. Provided, however, said tax may be paid in four installments, the first installment of twenty-five percentum on or before the twenty-fourth day of October, A. D. 1966, and the remaining installments as follows: Twenty-five percentum on the twenty-fourth day of January, A. D. 1967; Twenty-five percentum on the twenty-fourth day of April, A. D. 1967; and Twenty-five percentum on the twenty-fourth day of July, A. D. 1967. Each installment of taxes, if paid on or before the last day of each installment period successively and in order, shall be free from any charge for interest. If the first installment or any succeeding installment of taxes is not paid by the last date of the respective installment period or periods as they occur, then the whole tax or remaining unpaid balance of the tax, as the case may be, shall immediately become due and payable and
