SUBJECT: REFERRAL NO. 532 - ZONING CHANGE AT 1036 EDDY STREET

Gentlemen:

The subject referral received consideration by the City Plan Commission at a meeting held on Tuesday, October 27, 1953.

This referral is a request for a change in zoning from a Residence R-3 Zone to a Commercial C-2 Zone Lot 211 on Assessor's Plat 54 located on the easterly side of Eddy Street, and containing 5,000 square feet of land area.


On the field trip it was found that the area in question is at present occupied by a one-family dwelling. The surrounding area is mostly residential, and there are no other commercial uses along Eddy Street in the immediate vicinity.

This change from an R-3 Zone to a C-2 Zone is undesirable, and to avoid a case of spot zoning,
