

# RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Approved March 28, 1996

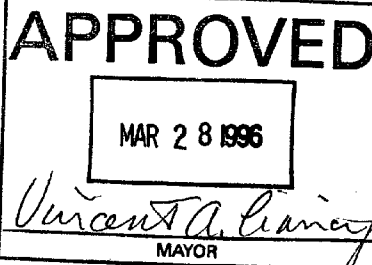
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Acting Director of Public Works is authorized to enter into an agreement satisfactory in form to the City Solicitor so as to facilitate the removal of barges located at India Point; provided, however, that the entity which removes said barges:

1. Provides some indicia of ownership of said barges;
2. Agrees to remove said barges in conformity with Federal, State, and local rule and regulation.
3. Indemnify the City of Providence, its agents, servants, servants and employees against all claims arising out of the removal of those barges.
4. Provide an insurance policy in an amount not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) protecting against loss or casualty arising out of the removal of said barges and listing the City of Providence, its agents, servants and employees as additional-named insured.

# RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 111

*Approved* March 28, 1996

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 797 of the City Council created a Committee on State Legislation on November 15, 1993; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of said committee was "to track, monitor and testify on legislation affecting the City of Providence; and

WHEREAS, said Committee as established is inconsistent with the Rules of the City Council adopted on January 2, 1995; and

WHEREAS, Rule 20(c) of said Rules of the City Council adopted January 2, 1995 provides for the creation of all special committees of the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council believes the tracking and monitoring of State legislation and testimony on state legislation affecting the City of Providence is important to the future deliberations of the City Council and the Welfare of the citizens of Providence,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That pursuant to Rule 20(c) of the rules of the City Council a *Special Committee on State Legislation* is hereby created;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Special Committee on State Legislation shall be charged with the responsibility of tracking and monitoring legislation and testifying before the legislature and its committees regarding all legislation proposed by the City Council and/or affecting the City of Providence;

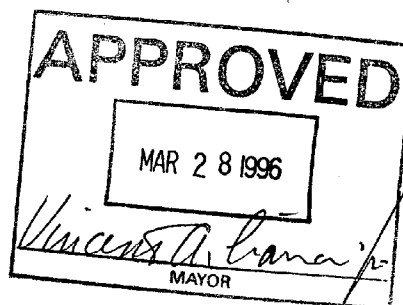

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the term of said Special Committee shall expire upon the Final adjournment of the January, 1996 session of the Rhode Island General Assembly

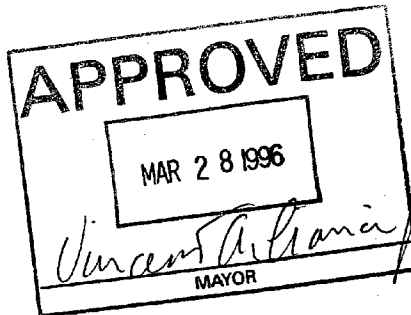
