



SUBJECT: Resolution requesting the Traffic Engineer to cause the installation of "Two-Hour Parking" on both sides of Bradford Street between Broadway and Federal Street.

The DPW-Traffic Engineering Division has investigated this request and the records show that Bradford Street between Broadway and Federal Street is only twenty-two feet two inches wide and two-way traffic is currently allowed north and south. The standard travel lane is ten (10) feet and the standard parking lane is eight and one half (8.5) feet. Since two-way traffic is allowed, you will need twenty (20) feet to allow for the two travel lanes, which will only leave two (2) feet for a parking space which is insufficient. If we were to allow parking on either side of this section of roadway it would present a safety hazard. Therefore the request to allow parking on both sides of the street cannot be granted because the roadway is too narrow to allow for the safe passage of vehicles.
