RESOLVED, That the Traffic Engineer is requested to cause the installation of "Slow-Children" signs along Pumgansett Street, from June Street to March Street.

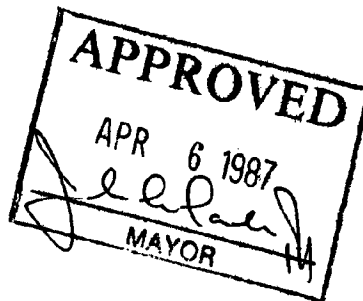
