DEPARTMENT OF LAW 2006 ANNUAL REPORT

INTRODUCTION

This Report is provided to the City Council and the Mayor pursuant to Home Rule Charter Section 1201(e) and Section 2-98 of the Code of Ordinances. Part I describes the organizational structure of the Department of Law. Part II summarizes major accomplishments by the Law Department in fiscal year 2005-2006. It also gives data on cases currently pending in the Department with reference to Appendix A, listing all such cases by attorney.

ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE

Management Team: City Solicitor Joseph M. Fernandez supervises the legal and administrative work of the Department; makes legal, policy and strategic decisions concerning work product; and serves as the liaison and chief counsel to the City Council and Administration. Deputy City Solicitor Adrienne G. Southgate supervises the daily operation of the office. In addition to her focus on corporate and regulatory matters, she staffs City Council and numerous other board and committee meetings.

Senior Assistant City Solicitors: Anthony F. Cottone, Kevin F. McHugh, Sara A. Rapport, William T. Smitherman, and Frederick W. Stolle, Jr. maintain significant caseloads, as well as the responsibilities delineated on the organizational chart attached hereto as Appendix B.

Assistant City Solicitors: Michael Calise, Steven L. Catalano, Kenneth B. Chiavarini, Maxford O. Foster, Pamela B. Quigley, Michael A. Tarro and Melissa C. Tucker (the Solicitor's former confidential assistant) have duties outlined in the organizational chart. The Department has hired two new assistant city solicitors to begin in the next fiscal year.

Support Staff and Paraprofessionals: Sheila Sanchez, Carolyn Ranucci, Allison Chiaverini, Martina Liberato, Sharon Mulcahey and Gregory Marcogliese comprise the outstanding support staff for the Law Department. The Solicitor has hired a new confidential assistant to begin in the next fiscal year.

DEPARTMENT ACCOMPLISHMENTS

The Law Department currently operates under a set of goals and objectives which were put in place at the beginning of the current fiscal year. The goals include satisfactory resolution of claims and lawsuits against the City of Providence; accurate and timely response to the City Council and City departments requesting legal assistance and support; fulfillment of the Solicitor's Home Rule Charter obligation to ensure the ethical conduct of City officials and employees; and representation of the City in a dispassionate, professional and competent manner. The objectives include enhancement of the Law Department's reputation and the respect accorded to its members in the courts, conference rooms and board rooms of the City; and the training and mentoring of the next generation of municipal attorneys.

The Department would like to highlight some major accomplishments during the past fiscal year.

Litigation:

In December 2005, a federal court jury found in favor of the City in the \$20,000,000 claim brought by the Estate of Cornel Young. Shortly thereafter, the appeal filed by the Estate was dismissed. The dismissal brought to a close a difficult chapter in the history of the City. The result was achieved through the persistence and hard work of Senior Assistant McHugh and outside counsel, with support from Senior Assistant Cottone, Assistant Calise and others.

With respect to tax litigation, Senior Assistants Stolle and Smitherman are continuing to reduce the backlog of tax cases inherited by the Administration. Senior Assistant Smitherman saved the City over \$2,000,000 by settling a tax appeal on favorable terms with Laurelmead Cooperative, Inc. Senior Assistant Cottone set an important precedent in the Rhode Island Supreme Court by defeating an attempt to recover over \$100,000 in attorneys' fees in a tax appeal filed by Union Station Associates and others. Senior Assistant Cottone also saved the City over \$225,000 by settling Harvard Pilgrim's tax appeal on favorable terms.

Other notable victories by Senior Assistant Cottone include a dismissal of a Superior Court challenge to the City's efforts to better regulate the towing of disabled vehicles, which had been brought by the Rhode Island Public Towing Association, and his successful handling of a challenge to the City's ability to regulate the demolition of landmark buildings downtown in a case brought by Granoff Realty, III, L.P. in the wake of an earlier ruling that the DOWNCITY District had not been validly created.

Senior Assistant Rapport successfully litigated a challenge to the City's construction of a new high school on Adelaide Avenue. The case, Sullivan v. City of

Providence, resulted in the issuance of two consent orders by the Superior Court which ensure the safe and timely construction of a much needed new building for Providence public school students. Senior Assistant Rapport also successfully defended a federal court employment case, Vargas v. Providence School Board, prevailing in a motion for summary judgment and negotiating a favorable settlement of the remaining claim.

Assistant Chiavarini won a significant Supreme Court victory in the Ruggeiro case, where he defeated an attempt to recover benefits under *both* the Workers' Compensation Act and the accidental disability pension provided by the Providence Retirement Board.

Finally, Senior Assistant Cottone led the implementation of an improved case management system for the roughly 500 cases against the City pending in state and federal courts. The Department will now be able to access case information by several indicators, including court filing number, the plaintiff's attorney handling the case, subject matter, monetary value, or involved City department. In addition, the database will enable the Department to track the progress of a case as discovery is completed and the case is assigned to trial, which will help ensure that cases where interest is accruing against the City are disposed of sooner rather than later. New procedures with respect to answering and assigning cases have also been implemented, and the comprehensive use of forms and resources for the Department's trial attorneys means that routine discovery and motion practice are standardized and more effective.

Transactional Advice:

The Law Department, through Senior Assistant Stolle, working with the Administration, oversaw the sale of the Civic Center to the Rhode Island Convention Center Authority. This complex transaction involved identifying the issues of the sale and negotiating business points presented by the Administration and the City Council. The preparation and the closing involved many moving parts demanding a considerable amount of time. The Law Department significantly contributed to the result: a fair price to the City for one of its crown jewels while ensuring its continued use as a vibrant part of our community.

The Department, again through Senior Assistant Stolle, also supported the issuance of Certificates of Participation in connection with the refinancing of ProvPort. We negotiated the tax stabilization agreement and helped prepare the documents for the financing. In particular, the Law Department worked through issues related to Lot 288 which resulted in litigation between the City and ProvPort. That litigation has now been dismissed with prejudice.

Among the many contracts, leases and licenses negotiated during the year, the new agreement with Amtrak and the State of Rhode Island for the continued use of Station Park, obtained through the efforts of Deputy Solicitor Southgate, stands out.

Corporate Matters:

Every City Council committee and every City department has ongoing requirements for corporate advice and assistance. The committees of the City Council, as well as individual members of the Council, need assistance in researching and drafting ordinances and resolutions, including tax stabilization agreements. During the past year, this meant 56 resolutions and 82 ordinances (or amendments to existing ordinances) were drafted by Deputy Solicitor Southgate, Senior Assistant Stolle and other members of the Law Department staff. The Department also assists Council members in responding to issues raised by constituents.

The Solicitor and Senior Assistant McHugh assisted the Police Department in working with the United States Department of Justice to revise use of force policies and train the police command staff in the implementation of those policies.

Significant time has been devoted to emergency preparedness initiatives, including the certification of five Providence schools as hurricane shelters, operating under a Memorandum of Understanding with the American Red Cross. The Solicitor has committed to a complete revamping of the legal documentation of the Providence Emergency Management Agency in the next fiscal year.

The Law Department worked closely with the Tax Collector to make a successful collection operation even more successful. Senior Assistant Stolle helped increase the rate of collection through the use of "dunning letters" and researching defenses made by taxpayers and was able to streamline the process for future collection and to "clean-up" past due accounts deemed to be no longer collectible.

Senior Assistant Cottone helped the Department of Public Works to take full advantage of existing state law and make environmental fines and clean-up costs assessed to homeowners more collectable by transforming the City's existing "clean and lien" program to a "clean and assess" (or in effect "clean and tax") program. Deputy Solicitor Southgate then wrote regulations to implement the change.

In the areas of open government and ethics, Deputy Solicitor Southgate and Assistant Tucker have conducted several training sessions on the Open Meetings Act and the Rhode Island Ethics Code. Deputy Solicitor Southgate successfully resolved an Open Meetings Act complaint against the Board of Licenses (In re: Café Renaissance) and obtained positive results in two matters pending before the Rhode Island Ethics

Commission involving the chairpersons of the Historic District Commission and the City Plan Commission.

Labor and Employment Matters:

For many years, the City utilized outside labor and employment counsel exclusively. Beginning in FY 2004-2005, the Law Department designated an assistant city solicitor as full-time, in-house labor and employment counsel. On a daily basis, Assistant Kenneth Chiavarini advises the Department of Human Resources, and departments such as Public Works, Parks, Communications, Fire and Treasury, on the administration of labor agreements, the calculation of benefits, accommodations and discipline.

During this past fiscal year, Assistant Chiaverini has been participating in the Pension Study Commission process, attending numerous meetings and providing the Commission with legal advice, research and drafts of various pension changes and recommendations for ordinances. Recently, he has provided the same type of assistance to the Salary Review Commission.

For the School Department, Assistant Chiaverini negotiated and drafted the five new labor agreements (Crossing Guards, BEST, Teacher Assistants, Bus Monitors and Clerks). He continues to provide the School Department with legal advice and services on all aspects of employment issues regarding these five contracts, work previously performed by more costly outside counsel. For the Police and Fire Departments, he continues to provide advice on disability and "IOD" issues, again work which had been outsourced.

In concert with the Human Resources Department, Assistant Chiaverini has conducted informational seminars on various labor-related matters for department directors and deputy directors. He has taken a much more active role with grievances and grievance resolution, meeting twice a month with the Union to resolve grievances and address various labor issues/concerns before a formal grievance is initiated. This has resulted in the reduction of grievances and arbitrations filed.

In the next fiscal year, Assistant Chiavarini will take on significant additional work and responsibility in connection with the administration of workers' compensation claims for the Director of Human Resources.

School Department Matters:

Senior Assistant Rapport has begun to play a more proactive role in advising the Superintendent and senior administrators on numerous systemic issues and concerns as part of an effort to improve the overall functioning of the School Department. Examples

of specific projects to date include the following: (1) revision of the Department's training on physical restraint policy and procedures, (2) reviewing and drafting the policy and procedure on the recruitment of high school students by military personnel, (3) preparation of the legal documents issued to parents for release of student information to third parties and the military, and (4) reviewing and rewriting student discipline procedures.

Senior Assistant Rapport has also conducted informational and training seminars on federal and state law before senior management staff and parent groups. In one such seminar, she and Law Department Claims Coordinator Sharon Mulcahey advised school building administrators on best practices (in preparation for litigation) in the investigation of personal injuries to students and visitors to school property.


Law Department Objectives:

The Law Department hired two new young lawyers during this fiscal year, one of whom is a graduate of Central High School and the University of Rhode Island's Talent Development Program. More and more, the staff of the Department reflects the diversity of the City we serve.

The Solicitor encourages the attorneys to engage in professional community service, which helps to enhance the Department's reputation. This year, Deputy Solicitor Southgate and Senior Assistant Smitherman have served as chairs of the Rhode Island Bar Association's Government Lawyers Committee. They will continue in those roles for the next two years. The Solicitor continues his service as the Chair of the Bar Association's Committee on Involvement of Minorities. Senior Assistant Cottone has continued his service as Chair of the RI Disabilities Law Center. Assistant Tucker and Assistant Foster worked *pro bono publico* to support the Solicitor in his role as a member of the Rhode Island Advisory Committee to the United States Commission on Civil Rights, which has commenced a year-long investigation into the interactions of minority youth with the public schools and the police in Rhode Island.

For the second consecutive year, the Rhode Island Supreme Court has granted the Department permission to conduct in-house Continuing Legal Education, facilitating our commitment to mentor and train the next generation of municipal lawyers. In addition to formal CLE programs, Senior Assistant Cottone conducts seminars for the junior lawyers on the elements of tort practice. Senior Assistant Cottone also wrote an article for the *Rhode Island Bar Journal* on municipal law practice.

EXHIBIT A

Beede Waste Oil - the United States Environmental Protection Agency has informed the City that it is a "potentially responsible party" liable to participate in the cleanup of a site formerly occupied by Beede Waste Oil. Damages to the City could exceed \$250,000 if proven.

Crespo v. Napolitano - action arising from a collision between a Providence fire engine and a passenger car operated by a woman who was killed in the accident. The City is defending the firefighter who was driving the engine, who has been sued in his individual and official capacities. The City will vigorously defend this claim but if proven, damages against the City could exceed \$700,000.

Fleet National Bank v. City of Providence - action challenging property tax valuations for several years. Damages against the City could exceed \$1,000,000 if proven.

Ivan Vladimer Ponce de Leon v. Providence Water Supply Board, et al. - consolidated wrongful death and personal injury actions arising from an act of arson in February of 1993 which resulted in the death of six individuals and personal injury to another. The plaintiffs have alleged gross negligence with respect to the City's efforts to contain the fire. If plaintiffs are successful, damages against the City could amount to \$700,000.

King v. City of Providence - action claiming age discrimination in failing to hire a police officer candidate. Damages include back pay and pension rights and could exceed \$1,000,000 if proven.

Law Enforcement Systems, Inc. v. Napolitano, in his capacity as Treasurer - action by losing bidder alleging that it should have been awarded parking and moving violations processing contract. The City will vigorously defend this claim but if proven, damages against the City could exceed \$1,000,000.

Local 799, International Association of Firefighters v. City of Providence - contract interest arbitration over pension cost-of-living adjustments for the year beginning July 1, 1992. Damages against the City could exceed \$1,000,000 if proven.

Manuel Vincent v. City of Providence - action alleging that Department of Public Works employee was fired illegally and without cause. Damages against the City could exceed \$250,000 if proven.

Newport School Committee v. Providence School Board - matter before the Commission of Education concerning a dispute over the residency status of approximately 40 students and the cost of their education, alleged to be approximately \$287,000.

Providence Firefighters v. City of Providence; Edward S. Abad v. City of Providence; John R. Arena v. City of Providence (consolidated) - arbitration involving firefighters and police officers seeking retroactive compounded cost-of-living increases to their pension benefit. Damages against the City could exceed \$1,000,000 if proven.

Providence Journal v. Rossi, in his capacity as Tax Assessor - action challenging property tax valuations for multiple years and properties which, taken together, may involve tax credits of more than \$100,000 for each year of assessment.

Walden v. City of Providence - action stemming from electronic surveillance conducted within the City's Public Safety Complex. If proven, damages against the City could exceed \$1.5 million.
