**SUBJECT: Referral No. 700 - REPLAT OF THE EASTERLY PORTION OF SMART PLAT NO. 1**

Gentlemen:

The subject referral received consideration by the City Plan Commission at a meeting held on Tuesday, April 12, 1955.

This referral is a request to replat the easterly portion of Smart Plat No. 1 on Assessor's Plat 97 located between Smart and Jasper Streets.

On the field trip it was found that the area in question is at present vacant. The proposed new street has already been graded. Two new one-family dwelling units are erected between Jasper and Smart Streets, the front lot lines of which are adjacent to the proposed Parente Street.

It should be pointed out that this is another instance which indicates the desirability of having subdivision regulations in effect in the City of Providence. The design of this street has little relation to the topography and no relation at all to surrounding properties. The two ends of the street are dead-end without turnarounds and abut property over which the street cannot be extended. In addition, no recognition has been given to the ultimate development of the property lying between the subject referral and Windmill Street to the east. This is a fairly large piece of property that may ultimately be developed into streets and lots. With subdivision control in effect it would be possible to require a more comprehensive treatment of the immediate and contiguous areas.

Under the provisions of Chapter 987 of the Public Laws of 1913, the only question involved in this referral is whether or not the City should accept the proposed street as a public way. The City presently can exercise no control as to the design of the street or the layout of the lots abutting on it. In view of the above facts:





the following named person, firm or corporation is hereby granted permission to erect, alter or use a building or structure at the location named herein for the sale of petroleum, kerosene, gasoline, coal oil and their products, compounds and components as described and shown in and on the application therefor and accompanying plat, all on file in the office of the Inspector of Buildings subject to the conditions that said person, firm or corporation shall not violate any of the laws of the State of Rhode Island or any of the Ordinances of the City of Providence relative to the erection, use or occupation of said structure and that said person, firm or corporation shall not allow petroleum, kerosene, gasoline, coal oil or their products, compounds or components, to be conveyed over or across any sidewalk by means of any pipe or hose, and upon such special conditions as are hereby enumerated, viz:

Ward 5: Maria DeBona, 651 Admiral Street, Plat 79, Lot 198, remove 2-500 and 1-5,000 gallon gasoline storage tanks and install 2-2,000 gallon gasoline storage tanks, making 4,000 gallons total storage capacity upon the premises.

The erection or location of any buildings or structures not shown on the original plat on file with the Inspector of Buildings or any change in the location of buildings or structures from that shown on said plat shall be deemed a violation of this permit.
