RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 65

Approved February 14, 1977

WHEREAS, John H. Chafee, well regarded Native of the City of Warwick, Rhode Island, is presently the Junior United States Senator from the State of Rhode Island and Providence Plantations, and

WHEREAS, Senator Chafee, who, as Governor of the Sovereign State of Rhode Island and Providence Plantations from January, 1963, to January, 1969, served his apprenticeship in political office, as a Member of the House of Representatives where he served from 1957 to the time he became Governor, and

WHEREAS, a valiant record of service with the United States Marine Corps in World War II, and in the Korean Campaign, Senator Chafee saw action during World War II at Guadal Canal, Okinawa, and in the China-Burma India Theatre of operations, terminating as a Captain, and

WHEREAS, Senator Chafee's public service included Memberships in various charitable organizations in which he contributed much time and his professional legal talent,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that in congratulating the Honorable John H. Chafee, scion of a distinguished Rhode Island Family, upon the occasion of his engagement as the Junior United States Senator from the State of Rhode Island the most sincere congratulations of His Honor Mayor Vincent A. Cianci, Jr., and of the Members of the City Council of Providence, are hereby extended to him, with best wishes that he continue serving this State with the same fervor that established his gubernatorial record of accomplishments, and
