
I am in receipt of your June 14, 1977 letter and enclosed resolution #368.

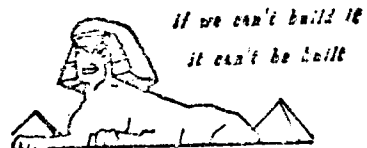
