That the following named streets shown as shaded areas on the accompanying plan entitled "Providence, Rhode Island, Department of Public Works - Engineering Office, Street Line Section, Plan No. 063922 dated May 12, 1975,"

viz:

Winslow Street, Winslow Place and Alley E Cross-Hatched Area (A-B-C-D-E-F-G-H-J-K-L-M-N-O-P-A) having ceased to be useful to the public and the same is proposed to be abandoned as public highway and the damage to the abutters is appraised at nothing and so awarded.

ORDERED, that the Director of Public Works, be and he is hereby directed to cause a sign to be placed on the above named streets abandoned as aforesaid, having thereon the words "Not a Public Highway," and it is further

ORDERED, that after the entry of this order or decree the City Clerk shall cause a notice thereof to be published in a newspaper published in the County of Providence at least once each week for three successive weeks and a further and personal notice shall be served by the City Sergeant upon every owner of land abutting the above-named streets which has been abandoned, who is known to reside within this State.



Dear Councilman Flynn:

On July 3, 1975, the Providence Redevelopment Agency petitioned the City Council for the abandonment of the above referred to streets, which matter was subsequently referred by the Council to the Committee on Public Works for consideration.

Weybosset Hill Development Corporation and Downtown Realty, Inc., the developer for the parcel of land which includes the aforesaid abandoned streets, proposes to construct 100 units of housing for the elderly at a cost in excess of \$2,000,000; however, the Federal Housing Administration will not process the financing until such time as the aforementioned streets have been abandoned and the developer can secure clear title to the entire parcel.

The developer and the Providence Redevelopment Agency respectfully request that this matter be expedited so that this development will not be terminated by FHA.


RE: Abandonment of Winslow Street, Winslow Place and Alley E.
