R E S O L U T I O N

RELATING TO FEDERAL BUDGET CUTS

It is Resolved by the General Assembly, as follows:

RESOLVED: That the State of Rhode Island appropriate a sum to the eight (8) Community Action Agencies incorporated in the state for the purpose of maintaining the vital services they provided to disadvantaged families and people living in Rhode Island, to off-set the loss of funds being eliminated from Community Services Block Grants due to be cut as a result of the Federal Budget Balancing Act, otherwise known as the Gramm-Rudman-Hollis Bill. Said appropriation will be in the form of a grant to the eight (8) Community Action Agencies not less nor greater than the amount that will be lost as a result of federal reductions.

EXPLANATION

This resolution would urge the State of Rhode Island to fund the State's Community Action Agencies a sum equal to the amount those agencies would lose as a result of federal reductions.
