

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 135

Approved April 21, 2010

WHEREAS, George M. Cohan was born in the Fox Point section of Providence on July 3, 1878; and

WHEREAS, In the early 20th century, he attained international fame as a songwriter, entertainer, theatrical producer and director, becoming known as “Mr. Broadway” and “the father of American musical comedy”; and

WHEREAS, He wrote such memorable songs as “Yankee Doodle Dandy,” “You’re a Grand Old Flag,” and “Give My Regards to Broadway,” as well as more than 50 plays; and

WHEREAS, A statue of Mr. Cohan has stood in the center of Times Square in New York City since 1959 in recognition of his musical and theatrical contributions; and

WHEREAS, He maintained strong ties to Providence throughout his life, always considering it his home; and


WHEREAS, Last year, the Providence City Council passed a resolution naming the intersection of Governor and Wickenden Streets “George M. Cohan Plaza”;


WHEREAS, By honoring Providence’s great artists and performers, the City helps to inspire future artists and bolster the entire arts community.


