Dear Sir:

I have figured the Street light outages in our customary way and arrived at a figure which compares favorably with the credit outage submitted with the enclosed September bill.

Outage credit was established by Mr. C. K. Davies and his engineering and accounting division. Based on the Annual Fuel Clause per City Contract, and 4001.5 hours per year.

Each light was computed as an individual in each circuit and time reported as an outage from the Superintendent of Street Lights division.

Each circuit was taken with its specific number of lights and its particular money rating per hour or day.

Again, I might say that this submitted figure is agreeable as an outage credit and wish to thank the Narragansett Electric Company for its cooperation after the devastating September Hurricane.


