RESOLVED, DECREED AND ORDERED:

That the following named highway shown as a cross-hatched area on the accompanying plan entitled "Providence, Rhode Island, Department of Public Works-Engineering Office, Street Line Section Map No. 063529, dated December 6, 1971,"

viz:

Guilder Street from the easterly line of South Water Street to the westerly line of South Main Street, having ceased to be useful to the public and the same is abandoned as a public highway and the damage to the abutters is appraised at nothing and so awarded, and it is further

ORDERED, that the Director of Public Works, be and he is hereby directed to cause a sign to be placed on the above-named highway abandoned as aforesaid, having thereon the words "Not a Public Highway," and it is further

ORDERED, that after the entry of this order or decree the City Clerk shall cause a notice thereof to be published in a newspaper published in the County of Providence at least once each week for three successive weeks and a further and personal notice shall be served by the City Sergeant upon every owner of land abutting the above-named highway which has been abandoned, who is known to reside within this State.

The Traffic Engineering Department has received the following petitions for abandonment of certain streets and has the following comment:

Request: To abandon Guilder Street, Harding's Alley, Bullion Street, Power Street, Gold Street, Silver Street and Well Street as public highways.

Disposition: This department offers no objection to the abandonment of the above mentioned streets provided that a new street or roadway be built between South Water Street and South Main Street in the vicinity of James Street so that suitable traffic circulation may be maintained. With the abandonment of these streets, there will be no way for a motorist to travel from South Water Street to South Main Street since the only remaining street (James Street) at the southerly end of the project and is a one-way street westerly, which allows traffic only to go from South Main Street to South Water Street. Without such a new street, the public safety and convenience will be impaired.

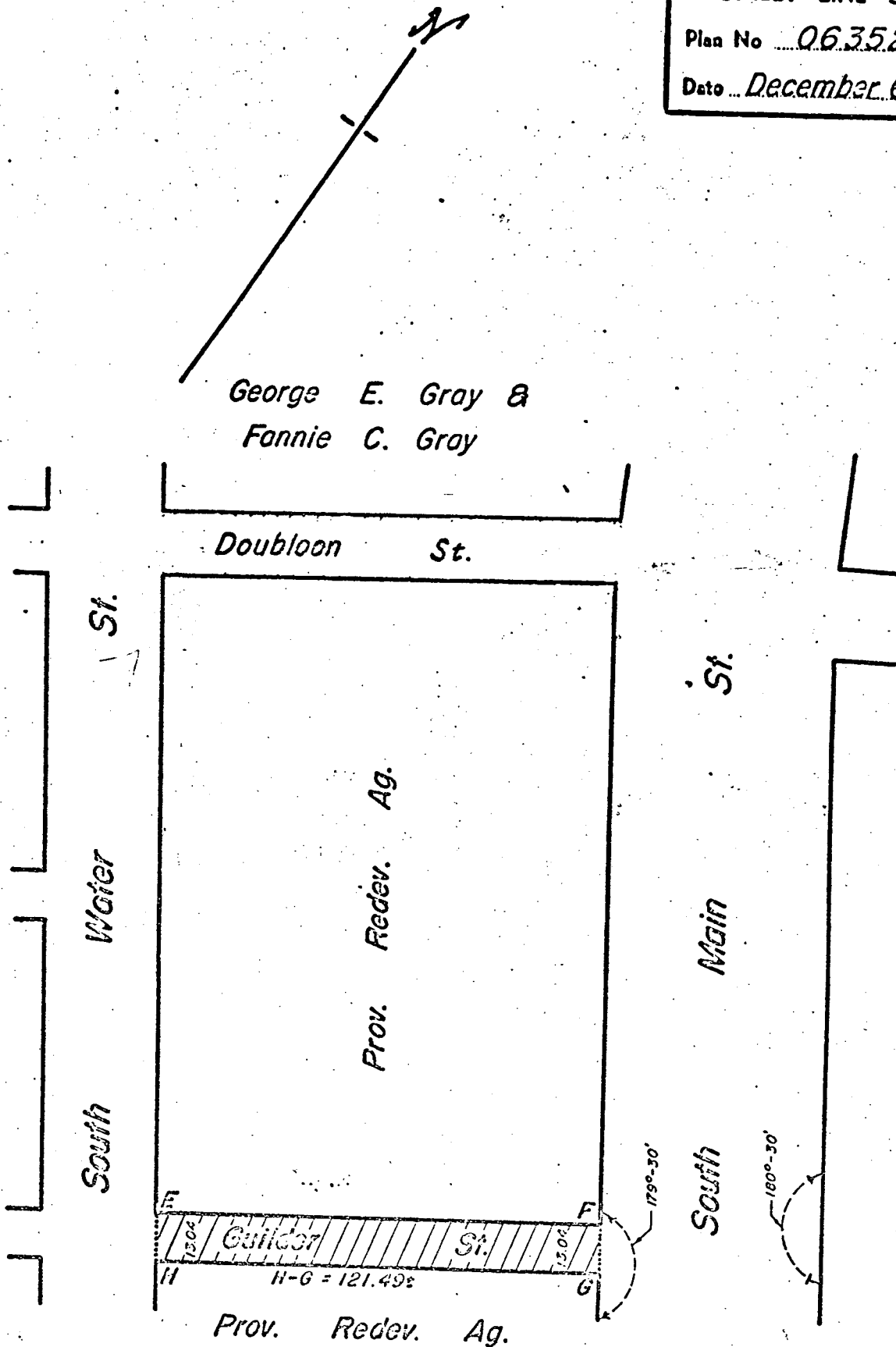
