

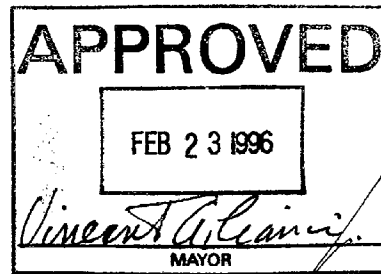

Dear Councilman Lombardi:

I am writing to request that you file a motion with the City Council to close two streets near the State House on June 15, 1996 from 12:00 noon until 12:00 midnight.

As you may know, the Olympic Torch Relay will be passing through Rhode Island on its way to the Olympic Games in Atlanta. The Torch will arrive in Providence on June 15, 1996. A Task Force of volunteers from the United Way, the Governor's office, the Mayor's office and representatives from the community at large are planning a celebration commemorating this exciting event. The festivities are being designed to reflect and celebrate Rhode Island's rich ethnic and historical heritage.

The community celebration will take place on the State House grounds from 5:00 p.m. until 10:00 p.m. Some of the activities being planned include entertainment by various ethnic groups, a live band, ethnic foods and craft displays, exhibits celebrating Rhode Island, and athletic demonstrations and interactive sports clinics for children. We are expecting crowds of 10,000 to 15,000 people.

On Saturday, June 15, 1996, we would like to close the following streets (see enclosed map) from 12:00 noon to 12:00 midnight: **Francis Street - from Smith Street to American Express Plaza** (the street that runs between the American Express building and Waterplace Park) and **Gaspee Street - from Smith Street to Francis Street**. We would like to be able to close these streets for several reason: 1) safety concerns - there will be large crowds at the events at the State House that day 2) the area should be free of traffic so that the public can view the torch when it arrives 3) we will be authorizing select vendors to sell food at the event and would like to keep other unauthorized vendors out of that immediate area 4) our exhibitors and entertainment will need easy access to the State House to unload equipment.

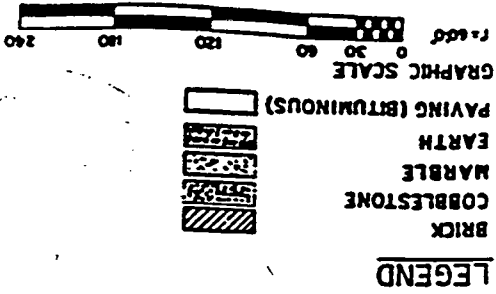

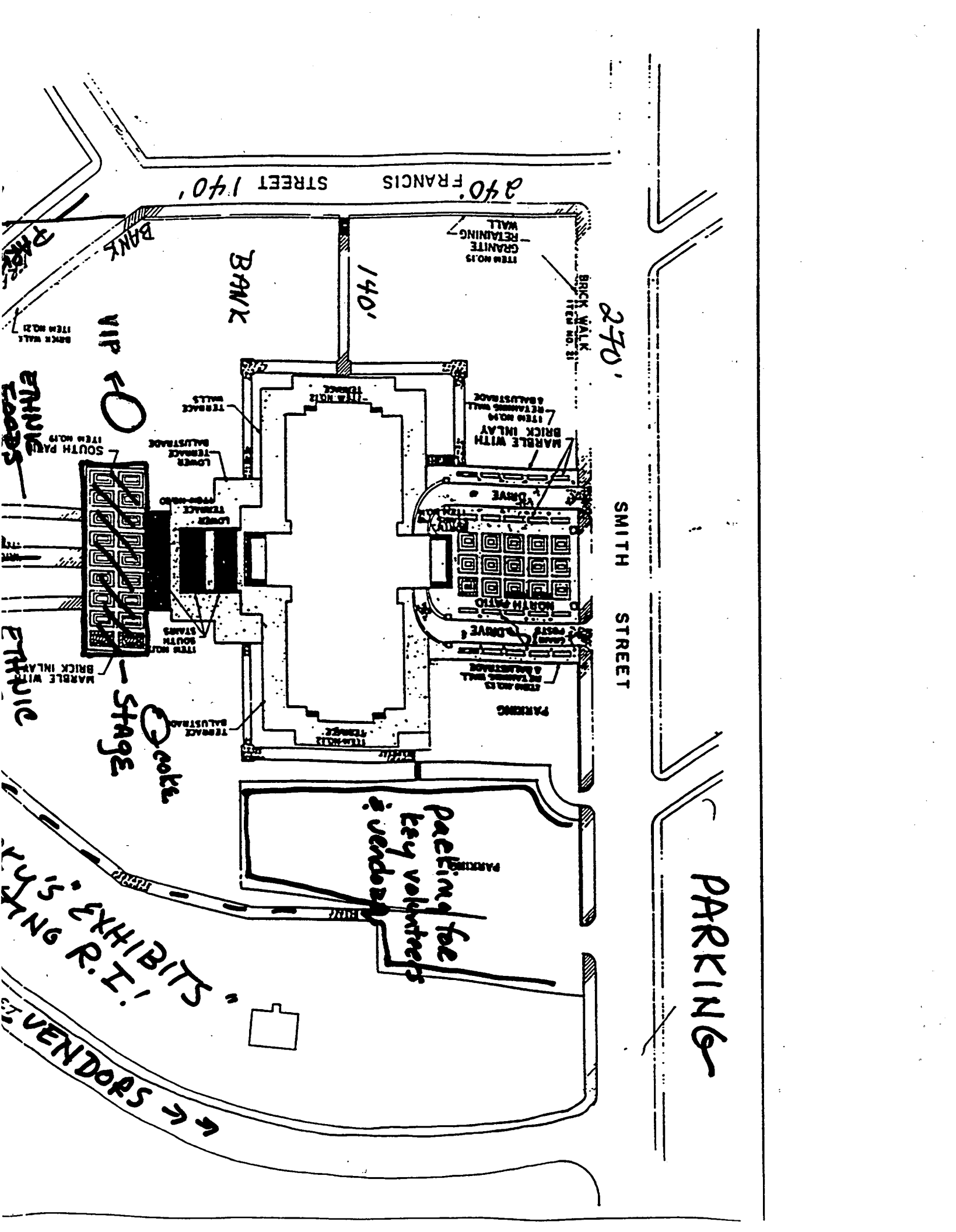

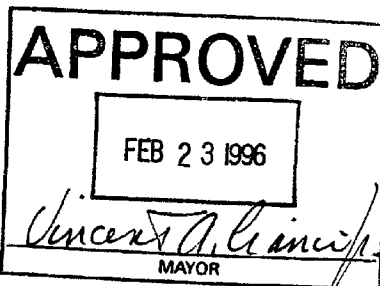
