

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 256

Approved June 23, 1972

WHEREAS, the Officers and Members of the Providence Police and Fire Departments once again, without regard to their personal safety, responded to a three alarm fire at the Jefferson Apartments, located along Broad Street, and

WHEREAS, these same stalwart members of the finest Police and Fire Departments in our Nation knocked down the conflagration without loss of a single life,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that in complementing the Officers and Members of the Providence Fire and Police Departments, His Honor, Mayor Joseph A. Doorley, Jr., and the Members of the City Council are not unmindful of the hazardous occupation these same men have been elected to pursue and for their dedication and heroism, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that upon the adoption of this Resolution, a duly certified copy be transmitted by the City Clerk to the Chiefs of the Police Department and of the Fire Department, that they may notify their Members of the esteem to which they are held by the Mayor and the Members of the City Council.
