

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 31-38 of the General Laws entitled "Inspection of Motor Vehicles"

2 is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section:

3 31-38-4.2. Security alarms -- Compliance with local noise ordinances. -- All motor
4 vehicles equipped with security alarms and registered in a city with a population of eighty
5 thousand (80,000) or more shall be inspected annually for compliance with any local law,
6 ordinance, code, rule or regulation, if any, governing the generation of noise. Such inspection
7 shall be performed at the same time as the inspection required under the provisions of section 31-
8 38-4 or section 31-38-5.

9 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 11-11 of the General Laws entitled "Disorderly Conduct" is hereby
2 amended by adding thereto the following section:

3 11-11-2.1. Defacing property. -- Any person who defaces or causes, aids in, or permits
4 the defacing of public or private property without the consent of the owner by any method of
5 defacement, including but limited to, painting, drawing, or writing, or otherwise marring the
6 surface of the property by use of paint, spray paint, ink, or any other substance or object,
7 commits a misdemeanor. Any person convicted of defacing property pursuant to this section
8 shall be ordered by the court to personally make repairs to any property damaged, or properties
9 similarly damaged, if possible. In addition, upon each conviction for defacing property pursuant
10 to this section, or adjudication as a juvenile delinquent for an act that would constitute defacing
11 property pursuant to this section if committed by an adult, the offender's driver's license shall be
12 revoked.

13 11-11-2.2. Mandatory revocation of license and permit. -- (1) The department shall
14 immediately revoke the license or permit of any driver or temporary driver upon receiving a
15 record showing that such driver has been convicted of defacing property.

16 Upon revoking the license of any person as required by this section, the department shall
17 immediately notify the licensee. Where a minor driver's or temporary driver's license is revoked
18 such revocation shall not run concurrently with any previous or subsequent suspension.

2 11-11-2.3. Licenses issued -- Denied. -- The department shall not issue any license to:

3 Any person who, while under the age of sixteen (1), was convicted of any offense that would

4 have made the person subject to having driving privileges revoked if such person had possessed

5 a driver's license. Any person denied a driver's license pursuant to this paragraph may be

6 granted a license six (6) months prior to his or her seventeenth (17th) birthday, if such person has

7 only one such conviction, and on his or her seventeenth (17th) birthday, if such person has more

8 than one such conviction; except that, if the person has been convicted of defacing property or

9 any counterpart municipal charter or ordinance offense to such section, the person may not be

10 granted a license until the entire period for which the person's license would have been revoked.

11 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
