No. 30 AN ORDINANCE IN AMENDMENT OF SECTION 43A 3 OF CHAPTER 544, THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE AUTHORIZING THE ZONING BOARD OF REVIEW OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE TO PERMIT A SPECIAL EXCEPTION FOR A BRANCH BANK, WITH OR WITHOUT DRIVE-IN TELLER FACILITIES IN AN R-3 ZONE.

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

SECTION 1. Section 43A 3 of Chapter 544, the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Providence, entitled "AN ORDINANCE ZONING THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE AND ESTABLISHING USE, HEIGHT AND AREA REGULATIONS", approved September 21, 1951, as amended, is hereby amended by adding:

"(g)" which reads as follows:

"Branch Bank, with or without drive-in teller facilities".

AN ORDINANCE in amendment of Section 43A, 3 of Chapter 544 of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Providence authorizing the Zoning Board of Review of the City of Providence to permit a use or without drive-in teller services and for a professional office building in an R-3 Zone.

PETITION OF AMERICO, Inc., to change from an R-1 One Family Zone to an R-2 Two Family Zone, Lots 73 and 74, as set out and delineated on City Assessor's Plat 114, as of December 31, 1966; said lots being situated along Celia Street.

Approved February 5, 1968

WHEREAS, Chapter 174 of the Public Laws 1964, known as "The Green Acres Land Acquisition Act of 1964, as amended," provides for the making of grants by the Director of the Department of Natural Resources to municipal bodies to assist them in the development of permanent interests in land for recreation-conservation purposes where such development is deemed essential to the proper long-range development and welfare of the local unit in accordance with a comprehensive plan for the development of the local unit; and

WHEREAS, THE City of Providence, Rhode Island, desires to develop certain land known as Shipyard Playground, which land is to be held and used for permanent recreation or conservation land as Recreation; and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that the total consideration to be paid for the development of said land will be \$51,527;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE, RHODE ISLAND AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the application be made to the Director of the Department of Natural Resources for a grant in an amount authorized by "The Green Acres Land Acquisition Act of 1964, as amended" of the State of Rhode Island, which amount is estimated to be \$7,842.00, and that the City of Providence, Rhode Island will pay the balance of the consideration for the development of such land and the total of all related costs out of the funds available to it, of which the Bureau of Outdoor Recreation has approved a grant for this project which amount is estimated to be \$15,685.
2. The Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to execute and file such application with the Director of the Department of Natural Resources; to provide additional information and furnish such documents as may be required; to execute such contracts as are required; and to act as the authorized correspondent of the City of Providence, Rhode Island.
3. That the proposed development is in accordance with the Master Plan for Public Recreation and Conservation for the provision of recreation or conservation land, and that, should said grant be made, the City of Providence, Rhode Island will retain said land for use designated in said application and approved by the Director of the Department of Natural Resources.

AN ACT

IN TESTAMENT OF A.D. IN ADDRESS TO CHAPTER 31-36 OF THE GENERAL
LAW ENTITLED "GASOLINE TAX"

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 31-36 of the General Law entitled "Gasoline Tax" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section:

"31-36-14. Exemption for Municipal Corporations--No fuels purchased by any city or town in the State of Rhode Island shall be subject to the imposition of any tax imposed by this Chapter."

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage and all acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
