AN ORDINANCE EMPOWERING THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE TO EXEMPT FROM LOCAL TAXATION, THE REAL AND PERSONAL PROPERTY OF THE PROVIDENCE TURNERS WITHIN SAID CITY.

Approved December 23, 1977

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

SECTION 1. The City Council of the City of Providence is hereby empowered to exempt from taxation the real and personal estate of "The Providence Turners", located at 118 Glenbridge Avenue, within and situated in the City of Providence.

SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall become effective upon its passage by the City Council and approval by the Mayor.

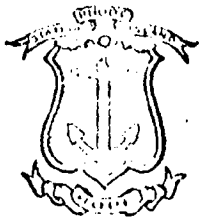

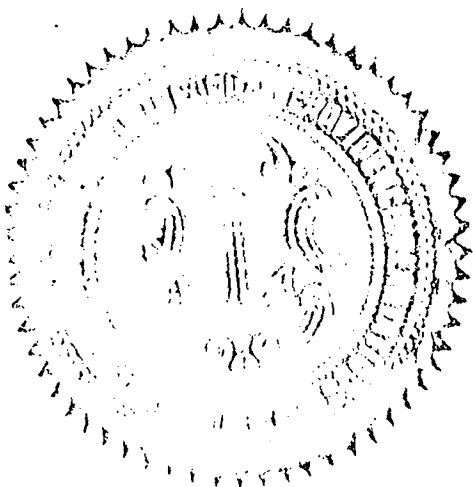

RE: Providence Turners - Request for
Exempt Status

The organization known as the Providence Turners first came to my attention last year when they applied for exempt status and/or a review of their assessment because of the revaluation.

The organizations' programs and services was reviewed thoroughly as well as the facility completely re-inspected for assessment purposes.

At the time of their application I could not recommend the Turners for exempt status because of the structure of the bylaws and constitution. It was recommended to them that they apply for exempt status through the General Assembly and that if the documents were properly drawn, this office would consider granting them exempt status.

For this year the Turners are assessed for \$30,060 with a total tax bill of \$1,545.09. Providing that the charter and by-laws have been re-written in accordance with the Rhode Island General Laws exempt statutes, I would recommend granting such exemption to them. I would, however, like an opportunity to review their documents at an early opportunity.


