*Now, Therefore, Be It Ordained By the City of Providence:*

*Section 1. To defray the expenses of the City of Providence for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1982, the sums of money or so much thereof, as are authorized by law, indicated in the accompanying schedule, are hereby appropriated*

for the objects and purposes, and in amounts expressed therein provided that payments thereunder shall be subject to the provisions of the Charter of the City of Providence, Chapter 832 of the Public Laws of 1940, enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Rhode Island at its January Session, A.D., 1940 and approved April 26, 1940, as amended, and subject to the provisions of the City Ordinances relative to the expenditures of money from the City Treasury. Title I Revenue Sharing, Fiscal Assistance to State and Local Government rules and regulations shall govern the portion of this Budget so designated.

*Sec. 2. All moneys appropriated are to be expended under the direction of the respective department heads unless otherwise provided subject to the approval of the Director of Finance. All moneys specifically earmarked with Federal Revenue Sharing Funds shall be so provided unless amended. Any unused Federal Revenue Sharing moneys not appropriated or not used shall not revert to surplus; but shall be reappropriated in the following fiscal year.*

*Sec. 3. The payments to the School Fund of the following estimated receipts included in the appropriation of \$55,884,684.07 for the support of the Public Schools for the City of Providence fiscal period 1981-1982, will be increased or decreased to conform with the actual amounts received from such sources during the City of Providence fiscal year 1981-1982.*

*Sec. 4 Monies from the Contingency Fund shall only be spent as reappropriated by Ordinance to an appropriate account,*

*Sec. 5 Chapter 17 of Article III of the Code of*

Ordinances of the City of Providence is hereby amended by adding Section 17-27, which will read as follows:

"Section 17-27 Providing for Ratification of Collective Bargaining Agreements. No Collective Bargaining Agreement between the City of Providence and any labor organization shall become effective unless and until ratified by the Providence City Council. Each contract, before submission to the City Council shall contain a fiscal note.

At least one Public Hearing shall be held prior to City Council ratification of any contract.

Sec. 6 Effective July 1, 1981 no car allowance shall be paid to any City Employee including employees of federally funded programs except,

1. At the rate of Twenty Cents (20¢) per mile in such employee's personal automobile driven on City business, pursuant to such employee's responsibilities.

2. With the approval of the Finance Director, or his designee, and of such mileage on forms signed by such employee and his or her department director, which forms shall be supplied and approved by the Finance Director, and in addition the only employees eligible for a car allowance shall be those occupying the following positions:

Assessor's Office—All Appraisers  
Building Inspection—  
All Building Inspectors  
All Plumbing Inspectors  
All Electrical Inspectors  
All Mechanical Equipment Inspectors  
All Housing Inspectors  
Weights & Measures—  
All personnel except office staff.

3. That no payment shall be made out of the Payroll Account, known as Item 20, and/or other, to any employee except for the purpose of providing compensation for out of classification

work and in no case shall such payment be made for an excess of three (3) working days consecutively without the approval of the Finance Director, in writing, nor for more than twenty (20) days in a given fiscal year without the approval of the Finance Director, in writing.

Sec. 7. The Finance Director is required to transfer twenty employees into the Park Department from whatever department or departments he sees fit and transfer appropriations to pay the sum and this be done irrespective of Section 65 of the Classification Ordinance and that same be accomplished within thirty days of passage of this Ordinance.

Sec. 8. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

**An Ordinance Providing for the Assessment and Collection of 1981 Taxes in the Sum Not Less than Eighty-Five Million, Fifty-Nine Thousand,**

**Six Hundred Dollars (\$85,059,600.00) and Not More than Ninety-Seven Million, Fifty-Nine Thousand, Six Hundred Dollars (\$97,059,600.00) Being Based on One Hundred Percent (100%) of the 1981-1982 Fiscal Year Tax Collection, as Amended.**

*Be it ordained by the City of Providence:*

*Section 1. The City Council of the City of Providence hereby orders the assessment and collection of a tax on the ratable real estate and tangible personal property, as well as orders the assessment and collection of any excise tax on all registered motor vehicles, in a sum not less than Eighty-Five Million, Fifty-Nine Thousand, Six Hundred Dollars (\$85,059,600.00) and not more than Ninety-Seven Million, Fifty-Nine Thousand, Six Hundred Dollars (\$97,059,600.00) being based on One Hundred Percent (100%) of the 1981-1982 Fiscal year tax collection, as amended; said tax is for ordinary expenses, charges for the payment of interest and indebtedness in whole or in part of said City and for other purposes authorized by law.*

*Sec. 2. The City Tax Assessor shall assess and apportion said tax on inhabitants and ratable real estate and tangible personal property of said City as of the 31st day of December A.D. 1980 at midnight, Eastern Standard Time, as well as assess and apportion said excise tax on the owners of registered motor vehicles in the City of Providence during calendar year 1980, according to law; and shall on completion of said assessment, date and sign the same, and shall make out and certify to the City Collector of the City of Providence, on or before the 15th day of June A.D. 1981, a complete list containing (1) the names of persons taxed and the total value of all the real estate taxed to each person, (2) the amount of personal estate except manufacturers' machinery and equipment assessed against each person, (3) the amount of manufacturers' machinery and equipment, (4) the amount of the motor vehicle excise assessment against each person, and (5) the total amount of tax assessed against each person on said real estate, personal*

estate and motor vehicle opposite the name of the person or persons assessed.

The assessment of real estate, personal estate and manufacturers' machinery and equipment shall appear in separate columns in said list. The assessment of motor vehicles shall appear on a separate list.

Said taxes shall be due and payable on and between the 1st day of July 1981 next, and the Twenty-Fifth day of July A.D. 1981 next, and all taxes remaining unpaid on said last named day shall carry until collected, a penalty at the rate of twelve percentum per annum upon such unpaid real estate and personal estate taxes, except that a penalty at the rate of twelve percentum per annum upon such unpaid excise taxes shall be levied.

Provided, however said taxes may be paid in four installments, the first installment of Twenty-Five percentum on or before the Twenty-Fifth day of July A.D. 1981 next, and the remaining installments as follows: Twenty-Five percentum on the Twenty-Fourth day of October A.D. 1981, Twenty-Five percentum on the Twenty-Sixth day of January A.D. 1982; and Twenty-Five percentum on the Twenty-Fourth day of April A.D. 1982. Each installment of taxes, if paid on or before the last day of each installment period successively and in order shall be free from any charges for interest.

If the first installment, or any succeeding installment of taxes, is not paid by the last day of the respective installment period or periods as they occur, then the whole tax or remaining unpaid balance of the tax, as the case may be, shall immediately become due and payable and shall carry, until collected, a penalty at the rate of

twelve percentum per annum on said real estate and personal estate, and penalty at the rate of twelve percentum per annum on said motor vehicle.

The City Collector, shall by advertisement in a public newspaper of the City, notify all persons assessed to pay their respective taxes at his office on and between the said 1st and Twenty-Fifth day of July A.D. 1981 both days inclusive; said Collector shall attend daily during said periods, Saturdays, Sundays, and Holidays excepted, at his office from Eight-Thirty o'clock A.M. to Four-Thirty o'clock P.M. to receive taxes.

2. The Director of Finance shall certify whether or not:

- a. Funds are included in the budget;
- b. The position is authorized.

3. If funds are not available and/or the position is not authorized, the Director of Finance shall *automatically* reject the requested personnel change unless an emergency exists as to the filling of the position and the Mayor so certifies in writing to the Director of Finance.

4. The Director of Finance shall also recommend rejection of any requests for hiring, reinstatement, transfer, etc., if in his opinion such requests are not justified in view of the City's current financial emergency.

5. The Director of Finance shall make such recommendations directly to the Mayor, who shall either personally approve or reject (in writing) the recommendations of the Finance Director consistent with the Mayor's Executive Order of February 6, 1981.

6. Concurrently with the making of any certification under paragraph (3), above, and concurrently with any approval or rejection under paragraph (5), above, the Mayor shall cause a true copy of any such certification, approval or rejection to be properly forwarded to the Chairperson of the Finance Committee of the Providence City Council and to the Providence Fiscal Commission.

An Ordinance Establishing a Compensation Plan for the City of Providence and Repealing Chapter 1981-13, Effective March 23, 1981.

*Be it Ordained by the City of Providence:*

*Section 1.* The following Compensation Plan is hereby adopted as the official Compensation Plan for all City Officials and workers services and shall be applied to positions in the service as hereinafter provided. Each salaried position is placed in one of thirty-five "Pay Grades" each of which contains five "Steps" in order to provide for periodic increases. ring the sum of One Hundred Thousand Dollars  
(\$100,000.00) from the Snow Removal Account (1-  
05-10-001) to Public Lands and Parks (1-07-02-  
131).

Section 2. This Emergency Ordinance shall take effect upon its Passage.
