WHEREAS, Omar was shot and killed on September 8, 2012 at his home, an unfortunate case of mistaken identity; and

WHEREAS, He is survived by his parents, Jenny and Nolberto Polanco, as well as his older brother and sister; and

WHEREAS, Omar Polanco will be remembered as a dear friend and a beloved family member; and

WHEREAS, Naming the Fogarty Basketball court by Mary Fogarty Elementary School in honor of Omar Polanco's memory would be an appropriate and fitting tribute to his life.







RE: Renaming of Harriet & Sayles Basketball Courts to the Omar Polanco Courts – Approved
TO: The Family of the Late Omar Polanco

At the November 1st, 2018 meeting of the Board of Park Commissioners, Wendy Nilsson requested, on behalf of the family of Omar Polanco and Councilman Luis Aponte, to rename the Harriet and Sayles Park Basketball Courts to Omar Polanco Courts. The renaming of the court pays tribute to beloved neighborhood youth Omar Polanco, who was killed in 2012 in a case of mistaken identity. The Board of Park Commissioners unanimously authorized the name change and extended their condolences to the family. Work will commence on the revitalization of the courts in the spring of 2019.
