ORDINANCES SECOND READING

The following Ordinances were in City Council April 6, 1989 Read and Passed the First Time and are Returned for Passage the Second Time.

An Ordinance in Amendment of Chapter 4 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Providence Entitled "Definitions".

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

Section 1. Section 4-31 of Chapter 4 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Providence entitled "Definitions" is hereby amended by adding the following definitions:

"Vicious dog: (1) Any dog that when unprovoked, inflicts bites or attacks a human being or other animals either on public or private property, or in a vicious or terrorizing manner, approaches any person in apparent attitude of attack upon the streets, sidewalks or any public grounds or places; or (2) any dog with a known propensity, tendency or disposition to attack unprovoked, to cause injury or to otherwise endanger the safety of human beings or domestic animals."

"Enclosure: A fence or structure of at least six feet in height, forming or causing an enclosure suitable to prevent the entry of young children. Such enclosure shall be securely enclosed and locked and designed with secure sides sufficient to prevent the animal from escaping."

Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

An Ordinance in Amendment of Chapter 4 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Providence, Entitled: "Animal and Fowl."

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

Section 1. Section 4-53 of Chapter 4 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Providence is hereby amended and shall read as follows:

"Section 4-53. Control of Vicious Dogs. All vicious dogs shall be confined in an enclosure. It shall be unlawful for any owner or keeper of any mischievous or vicious dog to permit such dog to run at large or without the enclosure of the owner or keeper thereof within the city limits, without being properly leashed and muzzled."

Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

An Ordinance in Amendment of Chapter 4 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Providence, Entitled: "Penalty for Violations of Sections 4-53 through 4-55".

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

Section 1. Section 4-56 of Chapter 4 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Providence entitled "Penalty for Violations of Sections 4-53 through 4-55" is hereby amended and shall read as follows:

"Any person convicted of violating the provisions set forth in sections 4-53, 4-54 and 4-55 shall be punished by a fine as specified by the General Laws of the State of Rhode Island, Section 4-13.1-9, inclusive. Each day any violation of said section shall continue, shall constitute a separate offense."

Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

An Ordinance Amending Chapter 16 "Offenses and Miscellaneous Provisions", Article III, "Noise Control" to Add Sections 16-108 and 16-109.

Section 1. Section 4-52 of Chapter 4 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Providence entitled, "Penalty for Violation of Article" is hereby amended and shall read as follows:

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

"Any person convicted of violating any provision of this article other than Sections 4-53, 4-54 and 4-55 shall be punished by the payment of a fine consisting of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) for a first offense, twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for a second offense, and fifty dollars (\$50.00) for a third (and any succeeding) violation, said fines to be recovered for the use of the city. If such violation be continued, each day's violation may constitute a separate offense."

Section 1. That Chapter 16 "Offenses and Miscellaneous Provisions", Article III "Noise Control", be amended to add Sections 16-108 and 16-109, as follows:

Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

Sec. 16-108. *General Noise Regulations* — Notwithstanding any other provision of this Chapter, and in addition thereto, it shall be unlawful for any person to willfully make or continue, or cause to be made or continued, any loud, unnecessary, excessive or offensive noise as defined in Section 16-92(m) above.

Severally Read and Collectively Passed, on motion of COUNCILMAN GLAVIN, seconded by COUNCILMAN DILLON, by the following Roll Call Vote:

Sec. 16-109. *Complaints.* Any person including a police officer, may be a complainant for the purpose of instituting action for any violation of this Article III.

Resolution for the Grant Application Submission under the R.I. Comprehensive Planning and Land Use Regulation Act.

Whereas, the Comprehensive Planning and Land Use Regulation Act, Chapter 45-22.2 of the *General Laws* of Rhode Island (the Act) requires that all cities and towns prepare and adopt a comprehensive plan that expresses the goals and policies of the City of Providence for future growth and development; and

Whereas, the comprehensive plan must be consistent with the goals of the Act and the State Guide Plan, and must contain nine elements as set forth in the Act; and

Whereas, the comprehensive plan must be carried out through specific public actions and through amendment of the zoning ordinances so as to conform with the comprehensive plan; and

Whereas, the Act makes grants available to assist municipalities to comply with its require-

ments, and the City of Providence desires to obtain such financial assistance;

Now therefore, the Council of the City of Providence does resolve that:

1. The Department of Planning and Development is hereby authorized to apply for, accept, administer and report on grant funds available under the Act;

2. All funds received shall be used to carry out the provisions of the Act;

3. The Director of Planning and Development is designated as the principal contact person with the City of Providence for purposes of entering into, administering, reporting on and concluding an agreement with the Department of Administration of the State of Rhode Island for purposes of carrying out the Act and this Resolution.
