Now, Therefore, Be It Ordained By the City of Providence:

Section 1. To defray the expenses of the City of Providence for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1985, the sums of money or so much thereof, as are authorized by law, indicated in the accompanying schedule, are hereby appropriated for the objects and purposes, and in amounts expressed therein provided that payments thereunder shall be subject to the provisions of the Home Rule Charter of 1980, validated by the General Assembly of the State of Rhode Island at its January Session, A.D., 1981 and approved November 4, 1980, and subject to the provisions of the City Ordinances relative to the expenditures of money from the City Treasury. Title I Revenue Sharing, Fiscal Assistance to State and Local Government rules and regulations shall govern the portion of this Budget so designated.

Sec. 2. The payments to the School Fund of the following estimated receipts included in the appropriation of \$67,514,082.00 for the support of the Public Schools for the City of Providence fiscal period 1984-1985, will be increased or decreased to conform with the actual amounts received from such sources during the City of Providence fiscal year 1984-1985.

Sec. 3. Any operating surplus that is achieved in the 1985 fiscal year will be applied to reduce the cumulative deficit of the City's general fund. Beginning with the 1986 fiscal year, the City will begin to make annual appropriations for deficit reduction, should this action be necessary, to comply with Section 45-12-22 of the General Laws.

Sec. 4. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

Section 1. The aforesaid Compensation Plan is hereby adopted for all City officers and employees and shall be applied to each, except as hereinafter described.

In order to provide for periodic increases each position is categorized as one (1) of thirty-five (35) "Pay Grades," each of which contains five (5) steps.

Sec. 2. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this ordinance, any and all employees in the Office of the Mayor shall be excepted from any salary established herein so long as the total of the compensation for such employees does not exceed the annual budget appropriation for personal services in the Office of the Mayor.

Sec. 3. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Ordinance the compensation for department heads and legal assistants to the City Solicitor shall be no greater than those herein specified; however, any department head or legal assistant to the City Solicitor may be compensated at a rate lower than that established herein and that lower compensation shall be allowed by this ordinance.

Sec. 4. The provisions of this ordinance shall be retroactive to July 1, 1984.

Sec. 5. This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

PRESENTATION OF RESOLUTION

COUNCILWOMAN BRASSIL (By Request):

Resolution requesting Approval by the City Council of the Method of Payment to the City of Providence of the Delinquent Charges Assessed Against the Outlet Building.

Whereas, The City Council by Resolution Number 102 dated February 13, 1984, requested the City of Providence not to defer the payment of the Outlet Building delinquent charges without approval of the City Council, and

Whereas, The City of Providence has arrived at an agreement subject to City Council approval regarding the payment to the City of Providence of the delinquent charges assessed against the Outlet Building, and

Whereas, The delinquent charges against said Outlet Building are as follows: Real Estate Taxes for the years 1981, 1982 and 1983 in the total amount of \$540,870.58; Tangible Taxes for the years 1981 and 1982 in the total amount of \$179,457.22; Interest for the years 1981, 1982 and 1983 in the total amount of \$98,002.73 plus Water and Sewer Use Fees charged to the building during the previous years, and

Whereas, The agreement arrived at between the City of Providence and the Developer is that the Developer will pay, at the time of the closing, all of the outstanding Real Estate Taxes, Water Bills and Sewer Use Fees amounting to approximately

\$600,000.00. As to the Tangible Taxes and Interest, 50% of the combined total or the sum of \$139,229.98 will be paid one year from the date of closing, and the balance of \$139,229.97 will be paid two years from the date of the closing, and in addition, the Developer will pay interest on the deferred Tangible Tax at an annual percentage rate of 12% per year.

Now, Therefore, be it Resolved, That the City Council of the City of Providence hereby approves the method of payment to the City of Providence of the Delinquent Charges assessed against the Outlet Building as hereinbefore set forth.
