ELECTRICAL INSPECTOR II

CLASS TITLE: Electrical Inspector II

CLASS DEFINITION: Responsible for supervisory inspection work in directing the field inspection of new and existing electrical installations to insure conformity with rules and regulations.

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF WORK: Work involves responsibility for supervising the inspection of new and existing electrical installations to insure conformity with established standards. The incumbent person participates in inspection work. When deemed necessary, advice and assistance is available from Superior. In difficult cases, work is assigned by a Superior.

ILLUSTRATIVE EXAMPLES OF WORK: Plans, assigns and supervises the work of subordinates and reviews their reports. Assists subordinate Inspectors in resolving controversies arising from misinterpretation of Laws, Ordinances and Regulations pertaining to Electrical Installations. Individually performs inspectional duties relative to new and existing installations of electrical wires, apparatus and equipment in all types of buildings and other structures to insure conformity with the Building Code regulating such installations. Check plans and specifications of proposed electrical installations, submits reports of violations and issues written and/or verbal orders for correction of same.

NECESSARY KNOWLEDGES, SKILLS AND ABILITIES: Thorough knowledge of Building Code regulations pertaining to electrical installations. Thorough knowledge of the methods, materials and techniques of the Electrical Trade. The ability to read and interpret plans and blue prints and to recognize deviations of such plans. Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with Contractors, Architects, Engineers and property owners. Ability to plan, assign and supervise the work of a staff engaged in electrical inspection work. Ability to enforce Rules and Regulations tactfully, impartially and firmly. Ability to express oneself clearly and concisely, orally and in writing.

QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED FOR APPOINTMENT: Graduation from a Standard High; or, Technical School, with courses in electrical related subjects. Completion of recognized Apprenticeship under a Journeyman Electrician with at least an additional five years experience as a Journeyman Electrician.
