

# RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Approved July 12, 1974

WHEREAS, injuries and near injuries have occurred with sufficient frequency to cause the zoo director to become alarmed, and

WHEREAS, more funds are needed for the security and safety of said zoo,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Providence City Council, being concerned with the security and safety conditions at the Roger Williams Park Zoo, do the following:

1. Hold hearings and invite suggestions and advice in its duly authorized committees concerning such security and safety conditions.
2. Consider and study the feasibility of modest charges to zoo visitors with the revenues, therefrom, earmarked for security, safety, and improvement to the zoo, and
3. Study and consider such other matters as are deemed relevant to the improvement of said zoo.

Dear Councilman Goldin:

I have left with the City Clerk's office petitions asking for a public hearing on the proposed ordinance presented by Councilmen Bradshaw and Pearlman at the May 16, 1974 City Council meeting, concerning the conditions at Roger Williams Park. May I remind you that this has been done in accordance with Section 3.17 of the City Charter which allows for a public hearing on resolutions before a committee of the City Council providing a petition is presented with at least 50 qualified voters' signatures.

There are two sets of petitions; the first set in which reference is made to the resolutions presented by the afore mentioned councilmen, contains 85 signatures. The second petition contains 29 qualified signatures but was felt to be legally questionable in its wording so a second petition was drawn up.

I request that this public hearing be held in the evening so that the working people of Washington Park and Elmwood may be able to attend and that it be held in a convenient location such as the Park Casino or Museum so that senior citizens and young people may better be able to attend due to the closeness to their homes.

Your sincere concern for conditions at Roger Williams Park can be best shown by accepting these petitions and working with the Ninth Ward Republican Committee to make the public hearing possible.
