

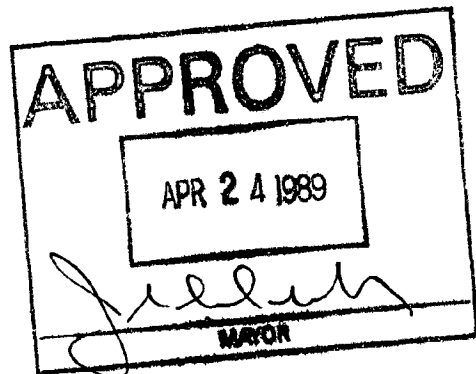

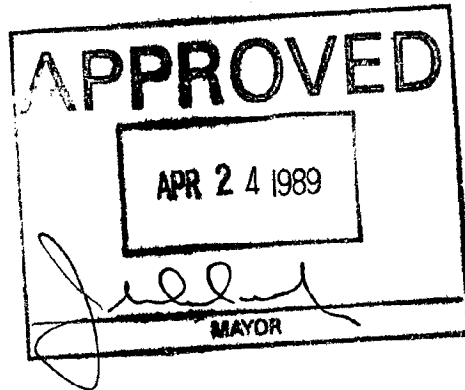

Approved: April 24, 1989

RESOLVED, That the Chief Electrical Inspector is requested to undertake a survey and to add additional street lighting along the following areas, if deemed advisable:

Angell and Hope Street intersection; southeast corner;

Hope Street between Angell and Waterman Streets; middle of the block, on the west side of Hope Street,

Waterman and Hope Streets intersection; northwest corner;

George Street at Brook Street; along the southeast corner;

Manning Street; existing Pole #8 relocated to the north side of the street or the deciduous tree blocking it should be severely trimmed as the light is fine in winter but problematic in other seasons,

Waterman and Governor Streets; at least one light needed here as this is a Brown shuttle stop and very dark;

Two or three additional lights along the Waterman Street, Hope Street and Angell Street area; and

Additional lighting, if necessary along the Wheeler School.

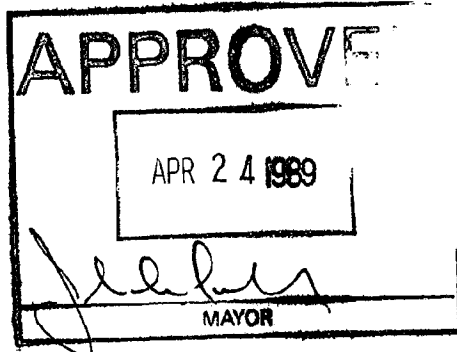

Dear Mac:

I write to follow up on a conversation I had with you last fall concerning additional street lights in the vicinity of the Brown campus. As you may recall, when we spoke, several rapes had occurred near the Brown campus, and we were looking at a variety of measures which could enhance security for students and residents alike.

We have concluded a survey and upgrading of on-campus lighting and have also worked directly with Narragansett Electric to have repaired existing non-functioning street lights.

Now we need to address sites where additional street lights appear to be needed. Officer Mark Perry, Brown Police and Security, and I toured the perimeter of the Brown campus, following approximately the Brown shuttle route, and identified the following areas which we believe would benefit from additional lighting:

Angell and Hope Street intersection: southeast corner

Hope Street between Angell and Waterman: middle of the block, on the west side of Hope

Waterman and Hope Street intersection: northwest corner

George Street at Brook Street: probably the southeast corner

Manning Street: existing pole #8 should be relocated to the north side of the street or the deciduous tree blocking it should be severely trimmed; the light is fine in winter but problematic in other seasons

Waterman and Governor: at least one light needed here; this is a Brown shuttle stop and very dark indeed. (I had occasion to use this stop once myself and decided I'd be safer walking alone than standing there in the dark waiting!)

I think we probably do not need 3 new lights in the Waterman-Hope-Angell area; 2 may be fine. But I checked with Narragansett Electric to get their assessment and they advised me to submit to you the full list of possibilities. I believe that Wheeler School would be supportive of additional lighting here, too, based on a very brief conversation I had with Bill Prescott about this.

I would ask that you and Carolyn Brassil jointly submit a resolution to the City Council asking for new street lights in the locations listed above. Additional lighting will help improve the safety of this area for all of us.

Please let me know if you need further information or ammunition! Thank you, in advance, for your help.
