

# RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 480

Approved September 7, 1966

WHEREAS, the United States Senator from Rhode Island, Claiborne Pell, has introduced into the United States Senate a Bill authorizing the establishment and operation of sea grant colleges; and

WHEREAS, the establishment of such colleges will serve the national interest by initiating and obtaining supporting programs of education, training, and research in the marine sciences; and

WHEREAS, the seas and oceans which bound the shores of our country and over which our ships sail represent the areas of greatest potential for economic growth and development and also are our areas of concern our national defense; and

WHEREAS, the State of Rhode Island and the City of Providence have always had a great interest in maritime affairs and the development of maritime resources because of our Narragansett Bay and the bordering Atlantic Ocean; and

WHEREAS, a sea grant college might well be established as a component of the University of Rhode Island, or located even here in the City of Providence, which would be to the economic and cultural advantage of our state and city, and would be a welcome addition to the numerous institutions of higher learning presently located in this City and State;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the City Council of the City of Providence does herewith memorialize Congress to enact Senate Bill S-2439 so that our national maritime resources and those available to our Nation may be developed to their fullest extent just as the agricultural resources of our land were developed with the assistance of our land grant colleges, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT a copy of this Resolution be sent to our Rhode Island Representatives in Congress, to wit, The Honorable John O. Pastore, Claiborne Pell, John E. Fogarty, and Fernand J. St. Germain; to the Honorable United States Senate and to the Honorable House of Representatives for forwarding to the appropriate Committees of said House and Senate.

WHEREAS, the need for suitable housing for low income families still persists to a great degree in this City; and

WHEREAS, Section 23 of the United States Housing Act authorizes a leasing program whereby suitable housing accommodations are made available in private dwellings for low income families, with subsidies made available through an agency such as the Housing Authority of the City of Providence, Rhode Island; and

WHEREAS, the Boston Housing Authority has already instituted such a program which will make readily available information concerning the same, and the experience of said agency thereunder;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that Housing Authority of the City of Providence, Rhode Island, be requested to consider the advisability of instituting a leasing program under the provisions of said Section 23 of the United States Housing Act for low income families of this City.
