6. That said Clement J. Cesaro has failed to attend meetings and to cooperate with the CETA administration regarding the deployment of summer employees under the CETA Act.
7. That said Clement J. Cesaro has refused to cooperate with the Water Supply Board regarding patching of water utility services in roads and sidewalks.

8. That said Clement J. Cesaro has failed to respond to complaints of subordinates and the City Solicitor relative to security at the Port of Providence.
