ORDINANCE SECOND READING

The following Ordinance was in City Council October 16, 1986, Read and Passed the First Time, and is Returned for Passage the Second Time:

An Ordinance in Amendment of Chapter 1982-11, Effective March 14, 1982, entitled: "An Ordinance Apportioning the Fifteen Wards in the City of Providence in Accordance with Section 204 of the Providence Home Rule Charter of 1980 as

approved by the Electors of the City of Providence at the General Election held November 4, 1980, as Amended."

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

Section 1. Chapter 1982-11 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, effective March 14, 1982, is hereby amended as follows:

a. Delete the Ninth Ward in its entirety and insert in lieu thereof:

"NINTH WARD

The Ninth Ward of the City of Providence shall consist of all that part of the City bounded by a line beginning at the point of intersection of Ontario Street and Elmwood Avenue; thence southeasterly along Elmwood Avenue crossing Interstate Route 95 to the on-ramp of Rhode Island Route 10; thence easterly on the on-ramp of Rhode Island Route 10 to the Center Line of Rhode Island Route 10; thence southerly on the Center Line of Rhode Island Route 10 to the Park Avenue on-ramp; thence southerly along the Park Avenue on-ramp to the northerly side of Park Avenue and the Providence, Cranston Boundary Line; thence southeasterly, and generally north-easterly along said boundary line to Montgomery Avenue; thence easterly along the Providence, Cranston Boundary Line to the Intersection of Broad Street and the Providence, Cranston Boundary Line; thence northwesterly along Broad Street crossing Interstate Route 95 to Potters Avenue; thence westerly along Potters Avenue to Hamilton Street; thence southerly along Hamilton Street to Congress Avenue; thence westerly along Congress Avenue to Melrose Street; thence southerly along Melrose Street to Ontario Street; thence westerly along Ontario Street to Elmwood Avenue to the point and place of beginning."

b. Delete the Eleventh Ward in its entirety and insert in lieu thereof:

"ELEVENTH WARD

The Eleventh Ward of the City of Providence shall consist of all that part of the City bounded by a line beginning at the point of intersection of Broad Street and Public Street; thence easterly along Public Street to an extension of Public Street to the center line of the Providence River;

thence northwesterly along said center line of the Providence River to a point in the easterly extension of Elm Street; thence westerly along the easterly extension of Elm Street to Elm Street; thence westerly along Elm Street and a line extension of Elm Street to the center line of Interstate Route 95; thence northwesterly along Interstate Route 95 to its intersection with Washington Street; thence southwesterly along Washington Street to Dean Street; thence southerly along Dean Street to Westminster Street; thence westerly along Westminster Street to Bridgham Street; thence southerly along Bridgham Street to Cranston Street; thence southwesterly along Cranston Street to Dexter Street; thence southerly along Dexter Street to Bucklin Street; thence southerly along Bucklin Street to Carter Street; thence easterly along Carter Street to Elmwood Avenue; thence southeasterly along Elmwood Avenue to Ontario Street; thence easterly along Ontario Street to Melrose Street; thence northerly along Melrose Street to Congress Avenue; thence easterly along Congress Avenue to Hamilton Street; thence northerly along Hamilton Street to Potters Avenue; thence easterly along Potters Avenue to Broad Street; thence northerly along Broad Street to Public Street to the point and place of beginning."

Section 2. This Ordinance shall ratify and affirm Ordinance Chapter 1986-20, as approved April 10, 1986.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

exceeds the value of the property to be disposed of by the City.

Now, therefore, be it resolved, that the Chief of Police, or his designee, is hereby authorized and empowered to cause the exchange of the City's unused and obsolete weapons, as heretofore described, for the weapons which it desires to acquire, as heretofore described, with Quick Arms & Supply Company.

Resolution Authorizing the Department of Planning and Development on Behalf of the City of Providence to Prepare and Submit an Application for an Urban Development Action Grant, as Amended. (Foundry Development Project.)

Whereas, The filing of Urban Development Action Grants by the City of Providence is authorized by Title I, Section 119, Part 570, Subpart G, of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended by Section 110 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1977, and as finalized on January 10, 1978; and as subsequently amended; and

Whereas, The aforesaid Federal regulations authorize the Department of Housing and Urban Development to make grants to assist distressed cities and distressed urban counties in revitalizing their economic bases and reclaiming deteriorated neighborhoods by means of public and private sector cooperation; and

Whereas, The City of Providence deems it necessary and in the public interest (1) to revitalize its commercial and retail sectors, (2) to increase employment opportunities in the city, (3) to increase the City's tax base, (4) to encourage

the cooperation of the public and private sectors to achieve these goals; and

Whereas, The City of Providence deems it appropriate to contribute to the aforementioned efforts by assuring the attraction, retention, and expansion of commerce especially in areas where revitalization is underway, and by arranging for financial support for such private business development projects; and

Whereas, Urban Development Action Grants are available for the activities and undertakings proposed herein.

Now, Therefore, be it Resolved by the City Council of the City of Providence as follows:

1. It is hereby found necessary and in the public interest to file an application to the Department of Housing and Urban Development for an Urban Development Action Grant for renovations and modifications to property on Promenade Street to create a multiuse marketplace. Action Grant funds shall be loaned to the company, The Foundry Associates.

2. The Mayor of the City of Providence, as Chief Executive, is hereby authorized to act as the official Representative and to file an application to the Department of Housing and Urban Development for an Action Grant for the Development of the Foundry Project, and to take the necessary action to carry out the terms and conditions of the Contract between the City of Providence and the Department of Housing and Urban Development relative to said Action Grant.

3. The Department of Planning and Development is hereby authorized and designated as the representative of the City for filing the application with the Department of Housing and Urban Development, and to do all work necessary to carry out the term of the contract between the City and the Department of Housing and Urban Development relative to said Urban Development Action Grant.

4. That the United States of America and the Department of Housing and Urban Development be, and they are hereby assured of full compliance by the City of Providence with all regulations of the United States government effectuating the receipt of Federal Grants under the Housing and Community Development Act, as amended.
