That the following Minute on the life and character of the late Rt. Rev. Monsignor Thomas J. McKitchen whose death occurred on June 27, 1957 is hereby adopted and ordered inscribed on the records of the City Council and a copy transmitted to the family of the deceased.

MINUTE

Rt. Rev. Thomas J. McKitchen was born in Pawtucket, R.I. on July 18, 1892, son of the late William H. and Catherine (Loughran) McKitchen. He received his early education in the parochial schools of Pawtucket and was graduated from LaSalle Academy in 1909. With the priesthood as his goal, he attended Mount Saint Marys College in Emmitsburg, Maryland and St. Marys Seminary in Baltimore where he was ordained by the late Cardinal Gibbons on May 25, 1916.

He crowded into his 41 years of priestly life more service and achievements than would seem humanly possible and gave to every assignment his meticulous attention and his inspiring leadership. His great services to his church were outstanding and have been acclaimed by thousands of his brethren but calls for assistance from outside agencies never went unheeded and he served his city, state and country with honor and great distinction. His first assignment was at the Cathedral of St. Peter and Paul where he was to later return and set a 30 year record for service, 16 years of which he was its rector. World War I found him in the armed service as a Chaplain with the rank Captain in the Chaplain-Reserves. Each summer from 1919 through 1932 he was in charge of St. Andrew's Church on Block Island. He was named pastor of St. Patrick's Church September 8, 1949 and on October 19, 1950 was elevated by Pope Pius XII to the rank of Domestic Prelate, with the title, Right Reverend Monsignor. In addition to his parish duties, Monsignor McKitchen served as director and organizer of the food and clothing campaigns for the distressed peoples of Europe. He was the first Catholic Chaplain of the Providence Fire Department and served until his death. He also served as Spiritual Director of the St. Vincent DePaul Society and acted as chaplain to the George and William Brock Memorial Post, American Legion and Court Bishop Harkins, Catholic Daughters of America. His direction of Servicemen's Centre during World War II brought signal honors to our city, its well rounded services to all enlisted personnel was highly rated by the thousands of servicemen who served in our state. His love and regard of his fellowman, especially the orphan, the aged, the needy and the sick, was manifested by the super-human effort he put into each Catholic Charity Fund Campaign, of which he was Executive Director, for the past quarter of a century. He lived to see the contributions quadruple and took pride in the fact that all but a very minor portion of the donations went directly to support the 25 agencies of mercy. His dynamic, devoted work plus the inspiration instilled in the volunteers, whom he recruited, held the cost of fund raising down to a mere one-third of one percent of fund donations. His fortitude and devotion to duty was particularly significant during the 1957 campaign when he carried on his heavy schedule while in the throes of his mortal illness.

His church, city and state mourn the loss of a zealous and kindly priest, an illustrious citizen and a public benefactor.

Whereas, this community suffered an irreparable loss on June 13, 1957 when the Rt. Rev. Monsignor Peter E. Blessing, Vicar General of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Providence was called to his eternal reward, and

WHEREAS, the passing of this cultured gentleman and revered churchman whose nearly sixty years of Christlike endeavors for the spiritual, temporal and cultural betterment of this community while leaving a void almost impossible to fill; nevertheless provides solace in the knowledge that a native son of the City of Providence by his exemplary life and good deeds has set an example for our youth to emulate, and

WHEREAS, Rt. Rev. Monsignor Blessing whose life-filled as it was with outstanding accomplishments would, were it to be chronicled in detail, require volumes to record; suffice to say he was born in Providence on February 13, 1873, the son of the late James E. and Mary (McNiff) Blessing. He received his early education in the local parochial schools and was graduated from LaSalle Academy. Following classical studies at Mt. St. Marys College in Emmitsburg, Maryland and North American College in Rome where he excelled as a scholar, he was awarded the degree of Doctor of Sacred Theology at the Propaganda University. Holy Orders were conferred on him on May 27, 1899 in the Cathedral of St. John Lateran by Archbishop Stoner. His first assignment after ordination was at St. Teresa's Church. Because of his acute mind and his gift of eloquence, he was appointed to the Diocesan Mission Band, became its director in 1905 and remained its head until 1912, during which time he was Rector of St. Edward's Church. In 1909 he became editor and manager of the Providence Visitor, a work which he carried on until 1912. From 1912 to 1916 he was rector of the Cathedral of St. Peter and Paul and was then appointed to the rectorship of St. Joseph's Church. After 20 years of parochial duty there he was named pastor of St. Michael's Church where he remained until his death. He was named Vicar General of the Diocese of Providence by Bishop Harkins in 1916 and was subsequently reappointed to that post by Bishops Hickey, Keough and McVinney. Pope Benedict XV in 1916 elevated him to Prothonotary Apostolic with title of Monsignor and during the same year he was the recipient of an Honorary Degree of Doctor of Laws from Notre Dame University. A prudent and able administrator in whatever field of parochial activity he was called upon to labor, Monsignor Blessing acted as President of the Board of Directors of the Providence Visitor, Treasurer of St. Joseph's Hospital, member of the Bishop's Council and Director of the Catholic cemeteries of the diocese. Twice he was called upon to administer the affairs of the diocese - after the death of Bishop Hickey, and again following the elevation of Archbishop Keough to the Primal See of Baltimore. Any movement which promised to add in any way to the community-at-large received his whole-hearted support and active participation. Since 1915 he was chaplain of R.I. State Council, Knights of Columbus and since 1922 he held the office of State Chaplain of the Ancient Order of Hibernians.

Now Therefore Be It Resolved that this City Council being mindful of his innumerable contributions to the welfare of the people of this City and State and conscious of the deep debt of gratitude which is due him; pauses in its deliberations to pay respect and honor to the memory of a cultured gentleman, a kindly advisor, an astute administrator and a saintly churchman, Right Reverend Monsignor Peter E. Blessing, D.D., Vicar General of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Providence.






