ELECTRONIC INSTRUMENT TECHNICIAN

(Water Supply Board)

CLASS TITLE: ELECTRONIC INSTRUMENT TECHNICIAN

CLASS DEFINITION: Responsible electrical work involving installation, repair, maintenance, calibration and testing of all types of electrical equipment pertaining to water supply operations.

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF WORK: The major portion of work involves the responsibility of maintaining and repairing a complex centralized control system consisting of solid state instrumentation, audio tone units, transmitters, receivers and all related electronic equipment vital to remote and/or automatic control of Purification Plant functions, pumping station operations, stand-by diesel-electric generator and hydro-electric station. Duties also include; trouble-shooting, repairs and maintenance of motor controls, instruments, transformers and appurtenant electrical apparatus.

EXAMPLES OF WORK: Analyze and correct faults by use of decibel (VU) meter and oscillographs. Repair and calibrate filter loss-of-head components, square root extractors, integrators, recorders and similar equipment for various rates of water flow.

Assist engineering department in preparation of estimates and long-range plans.

Perform minor repairs to motor controls and related circuitry.

The above examples are typical and are not intended to include all the work requirements of the classification.

NECESSARY SKILLS AND ABILITIES: A basic knowledge of electronic and electrical circuit principles. A working knowledge of electronics, industrial electrical systems and appurtenant components as applied to water supply operations.

QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED FOR APPOINTMENT: A high school graduate or a recognized equivalent education with a minimum of ten (10) years experience in electronic controls and general industrial type electrical operations. Extensive experience and training in the installation, operation and maintenance of electronic equipment, control circuits, power centers and related electrical work.


Pursuant to review and verbal approval of Mayor Doorley, we request that you obtain authorization of the City Council for the establishment of a position for a new classification titled Electronic Instrument Technician at the ~~rate of \$5.00/hr.~~ for a forty (40) hour work week with yearly increments increases of \$0.25/Hr. through five steps and an annual salary range of \$10,400 to ^{11,280}~~\$12,480~~. The duties of this classification are outlined in the enclosed job description.

During the years 1926-1959 the operator of the Hydro-Electric Station was capable of performing minor electrical repairs throughout our system. Since this employee's retirement in 1959 we have been required to engage the services of electrical contractors to perform normal and emergency repairs. With the recent completion of our new centralized control system at the Purification Works it becomes imperative that we employ a person qualified for this specialized type of work outlined on the job description.

The alternative to this request would require the department to enter into a contract for the work which would amount to \$22,260/Yr.; subject to escalation due to increased labor costs. This contract would consist only of part time maintenance, approximately five days per month, to the centralized control system whereas, an employee in the requested classification would be available daily for this maintenance as well as emergencies and miscellaneous electrical work throughout our facilities.

ASSISTANT FIRE CHIEF

CLASS TITLE: Assistant Fire Chief

CLASS DEFINITION: The Assistant Chiefs shall serve as Assistants to the Chief of Department with specific responsibilities in areas of operation as assigned by the Chief of Department.

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF WORK: As directed by the Chief of Department an Assistant Chief shall serve as Chief of Department in his absence.

As directed by the Chief of Department, an Assistant Chief shall be in command of fire ground operations at multiple alarm fires.

As directed by the Chief of Department, an Assistant Chief during emergencies shall assume responsibility for control of those units of the department which are not employed in fire-fighting activities.

As directed by the Chief of Department, an Assistant Chief shall be assigned the responsibility for supervision in the following specific areas of operation, as listed below:

Supervision of Battalion Chiefs; Training; Drills;
Fire-fighting Operations; Fire Prevention Programs;
In-Service Inspections; Group Inspections; Public
Relations; Water Supply; Personnel; Driver Training;
Maintenance of Apparatus; Building Maintenance and
Discipline.

Shall make weekly reports to Chief of Department on activities in aforementioned areas.

QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED FOR APPOINTMENT: Thorough knowledge of modern fire-fighting techniques; demonstrated ability to direct and coordinate fire-fighting activities; ability to maintain discipline; demonstrated administrative ability; resourcefulness; sound judgment in emergencies; good physical condition.

EXPERIENCE AND TRAINING: One (1) year of satisfactory service as a permanent Battalion Chief.
