

# RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 388

Approved July 12, 1974

WHEREAS, Joseph A. Delaney, elected to terminate his services with the Providence School System as of June 28, 1974, following a well rounded and productive teaching and administrative career, which commenced in September of 1944, and

WHEREAS, his teaching career which began as an Elementary Physical Education Instructor; Teacher and Football Coach at Hope Senior High School to 1957, and as Assistant Principal there until 1965; Assistant Superintendent for Personnel until 1968 and finally as Principal of Mount Pleasant Senior High School, until his elected termination, and

WHEREAS, the popular "Joe" Delaney whose athletic career started as a school boy football star and then as a football luminary at Holy Cross College, enjoyed a fine reputation in the City's School System, for his fairness and personal interest in the development of those of his students who benefited by his instructions
