It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

45-25-35. Providence Indian Housing Authority. -- (a) The city
council of the city of Providence is hereby authorized to provide by
ordinance for the creation and establishment of a Providence Indian
Housing Authority pursuant to the requirements of this chapter.

(b) The Providence Indian Housing Authority shall be organized
for the purpose of directly or indirectly providing dwelling
accommodations in the city of Providence for low income individuals
including, but not limited to those of Indian ancestry. It is the
intent of the general assembly by the passage of this section to

authorize the creation and establishment of a housing authority which is eligible to apply for federal funds described in part 905 of title 24 of the Code of Federal Regulations.

(c) The Providence Indian Housing Authority shall consist of at least five (5) commissioners, three (3) of whom shall be appointed by the mayor and two (2) of whom shall be appointed by the city council of the city of Providence each to serve a five (5) year term.

At least three (3) commissioners shall be duly enrolled members of a federally recognized Indian tribe and all shall reside in the city of Providence. No person shall be barred from serving as a commissioner because he or she is a tenant or home owner in a dwelling accommodation directly or indirectly provided by the Providence Indian Housing Authority.

(d) The Providence Indian Housing Authority shall cooperate with federally recognized Indian tribes and Indian organizations within the state whose members or constituents may be eligible for dwelling accommodations directly or indirectly provided by the Providence Indian Housing Authority.

(e) Nothing in this section is to be construed to authorize the establishment of gambling facilities anywhere in the state of Rhode Island by any person.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
