# RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

WHEREAS, Mayor Vincent A. Cianci, Jr., has issued Executive Order No. 11 which has resulted in chaos with the purchasing procedures in the City of Providence, and

WHEREAS, there has become effective on June 27, 1977, Ordinance Chapter 1977-28, in which Mayor Vincent A. Cianci, Jr., has been ordered to comply with the provisions of Article VI $\frac{1}{2}$  to return the Division of Purchasing within the Department of Public Property, and

WHEREAS, the Mayor has pre-empted the responsibility of the City Council to make rules and regulations relating to purchasing functions in accordance with the provisions of Section 6.6 of the Charter of the City of Providence,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Director of Public Property be and he is hereby ordered to comply, at once, with the provisions of the above noted Ordinance and that the Division of Purchasing be immediately returned to the Department of Public Property in order to comply with the foregoing effective Ordinance.
