In Re: Additional Street Lighting

Dear Mr. Vespa:

At your request, after conversing with my superior, Mr. Daniel E. Healy, Director of Public Works, on the current situation involving additional street lighting petitions.

Please be advised that all petitions received for additional street lights, within the City of Providence will be installed only in emergency situations that are considered serious or where new property construction requires normal street lighting.

The Master Plan for relighting the City of Providence is still not completed; but all the neighborhood streets have been completed with new mercury vapor lights according to the approved Master Plan.

However, there still remains about 1400 more lights to be converted along our major streets before the plan is finished, and approximately 80 more fixtures to be installed in Roger Williams Park.

After the completion of the Master Plan these petitions for additional lights will be considered.

Last months street lighting bill, as you know, was for \$80,698.51, and still rising until the plan is completed.

Therefore, with the economics, the way they are presently, it would only seem fitting to install any future additional lights on absolute necessity basis.
