
Dear Councilman:

I understand you have submitted a resolution to the City Council asking that Brown "assure area residents that their recent radioactive problems have been corrected."

I assume you are referring to the stories that have appeared in local media about the contamination of two lab workers under mysterious circumstances.

If so, neither of those cases posed problems to area residents. In fact, evidence obtained during those two incidents indicated that they were not the result of accident or carelessness, nor is there any evidence to suggest that the University was negligent. The laboratory has resumed full operation with the approval of the State Department of Health.
