Stanley Weiss is Chairman of the Providence Public Buildings Authority, reappointed by three mayors. Mr. Weiss was previously a member of the Capital Center Commission, appointed and reappointed by three Governors, and more recently served as a Board Member of Commerce Rhode Island, appointed by Governor Chafee. For more than a decade, he has been a trustee of the Providence Foundation. He is also a trustee of the Providence Performing Arts Center. Prior to that, Weiss was Chairman of the Providence Review Commission and Commissioner on the Port of Providence.

He is a graduate of the National Graduate Trust School at Northwestern University and a Certified Financial Counselor. He has graduated with Honors from Hunter College (B.A.-- Sociology/Political Science) and has an M.A. from University of Michigan, under a Metropolitan Community research fellowship; post-graduate work, Brown University in 1965, under a National Science Foundation fellowship in Urban Sociology.

Mr. Weiss developed a number of real estate projects before and during employment with Citizens Trust Company as a Vice President in the Trust Department. He has been the Managing Partner of the University Heights shopping center/apartment complex in Providence. Also, has developed the Hotel Providence, and Grace Park. He additionally restored the Fletcher and Mason Buildings on Weybosset St. and brought in RISD as its major tenant.

He has received Statewide preservation awards for his restoration of the Tilden Thurber Building on the corners of Westminster and Mathewson.
