Dear Chairwoman Brassil:

We wish to bring to the attention of the Finance Committee a situation in the Telephone Switchboard Room that represents inequitable treatment of employees. There are three (3) positions there (all on the payroll of the Communications Division); two are classified as Switchboard Operator I, and one is classified as Switchboard Operator II. Clearly, they all perform precisely identical tasks and all three ought to be compensated at the same rate of pay.

Since the Union has raised the issue of equity in this matter, we ask that the Finance Committee prepare a revision of the Compensation Ordinance to equalize the pay for each of these three jobs.

Your assistance, as always, is respectfully appreciated.


Dear Councilwoman Brassil:

In accordance with an October 24, 1984 agreement between this Administration and Public Service Employees' Union Local 1033, I am bringing the following situation to the attention of the Finance Committee.

The city currently employs two switchboard operators at City Hall. One is classified as an Operator I, and the other as an Operator II, at a salary that is \$5 a week higher. Both employees do exactly the same work.

This apparent inequity can be remedied by substituting an Operator II position for the Operator I position in the City's 1985-86 fiscal year budget, and I so recommend.
